RENUNCIANTS TO COME UNDER PROTECTING POWER

Japanese Americans whose renunciations of U.S. citizenship are approved by the Attorney General will come under the jurisdiction of the Protecting Power if they present to the Spanish Embassy a photostatic copy of the document issued by the Attorney General, according to a letter received here by the Spokesmen Committee from F. de Amat, Spanish Consul at San Francisco.

RELOCATION OFFICE TO BE SET UP NEAR GATE #1

Plans have been made for a Relocation Office near the Post Office, the Administration made known today. The office, which is being established to provide information concerning areas in the U.S., will be accessible to the colonists without the benefit of a gate pass. Until completion of the new quarters, the office will continue to operate in the Personnel Building in the Administration area.

It was also announced that the Relocation Division has now absorbed the Leave Office; therefore, it will handle all short-term and terminal leaves, and will approve visits to this center. In addition, the division will release an individual's status if requested by the person concerned.

Preparations have also been started for a complete library to provide information on all localities in which persons may be interested, including specific facts as to climate, soil, school dates, business and agricultural opportunities. The location of this unit has not been decided upon definitely.

RED CROSS DRIVE FOR \$2663 TO OPEN MARCH 1

March 1 has been set as the opening day of the annual Red Cross fund drive, disclosed the Red Cross at 3001-A today. With the goal set for \$2663, the drive will continue throughout the month.

Executive Secretary May Nakagawa emphasized that the money collected in the drive will be expended within the colony for the welfare of the residents.

The \$2285.11 raised in last year's fund drive was used principally in purchasing materials and yarns to furnish clothing for the needy, to supply each block with first aid kits (also

to buy refills for the kits), to defray expenses incurred in handling Red Cross messages and cables, and for many other worthy causes, it was stated.

COMPLETION OF JAIL ANNOUNCED

Completion of the colony jail west of the Motor Pool area after six months of work was revealed today by J.B. Cook, chief of Internal Security.

Constructed of reinforced concrete, the gaol can house 24 persons; 50 in case of emergency. There are four cells for men and two for women. A kitchen, two office rooms, and a storage room complete the jail house, it was stated.

2 SOCIETY LEADERS SENTENCED 30 DAYS AT PROJECT TRIAL

Shigeyoshi Kawabata, president of Sokuji Kikoku Hoshi Dan, and Minoru Hinoki, president of Hokoku Seinen Dan, were found guilty, after a project trial Tuesday afternoon, of unlawful assembly and were sentenced to confinement for 30 days in the project jail and to 60 days of probation thereafter, stated the Administration.

The presidents of the two societies, activities of which have been disclosed by the Department of Justice to be unlawful, were served arrest warrants upon questioning at Internal Security Headquarters after a raid by officers on a meeting held Monday in the Block 82 ironing room.

**SECOND STATEMENT MADE
ON CENTER SITUATION**

Project Director Ray Best today revealed so many letters have been received by the Administration from residents in response to last week's statement, that it is impossible to acknowledge them all personally. Therefore, the project director issued the following second statement regarding the center situation:

"We have received so many letters from both old and young persons stating that they have withdrawn from the Sokuji Kikoku Hoshi Dan and the Hokoku Seinen Dan that it has been impossible for us to acknowledge them individually.

"I wish to take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation of the prompt indication of desire to go on record as peaceful, law-abiding residents.

"These letters state that the writers had joined the organizations because they had been misinformed or misled by the leaders.

"I wish to assure these persons, and any others who have withdrawn from these organizations, that their standing with the authorities of this center will be identical with that of other peaceful and law-abiding residents so long as they refrain from unlawful activities, such as participating in group Jap-

anese nationalistic ceremonies, including semi-military drilling and bugle blowing, and wearing of emblems of insigne symbolic of Japanese nationalism or Japanese nationalistic organizations."

NEW POSTAL RULING EASES MONEY ORDER REGULATIONS

Postal notes may now be purchased instead of money orders when sending 10 dollars or less, according to Tony Morimoto, evacuee post office head.

No applications are necessary, but the purchaser must fill in the name and the address of the payee on the face of the note as well as his own name and address on the back. The notes are available at their face value plus 5 cents for the fee. They are not negotiable or transferable.

Notes will be cashed at any bank or post office in the U.S. if presented within 60 days after purchase.



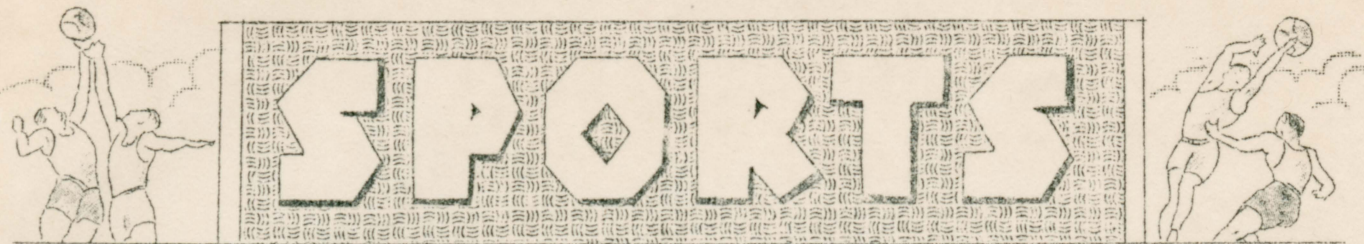
