## SPAIN QUILTS AS PROTECTING POWER

### NISEI INDUCTED VICE CONSUL OF SPAIN LEAVES INTO U.S. ARMY CENTER AFTER RECEIVING ORDER NOW TOTAL 17,600

Approximately 14,600 American citizens of Japanese ancestry have been inducted into the Army since Nov. 1, 1940, information received by the WRA from the War Department reveals, Dillon Myer, WRA director, has announced, this being 4,600 more than figures of a previous estimate.

Induction figures include those Japanese-Americans from the mainland and those from Hawaii, approximately 50 per cent of the figure coming from each.

In addition to volunteers and inductees prior to the Pearl Harbor attack, 2599 have been inducted from WRA centers, Myer said, while 189 have been taken into enlisted reserve corps and 897 have been classified 1-A.

The Japanese Government was left without neutral representation in the U. S. last Saturday when the Government of Spain announced its withdrawal as Protecting Power. Arrangements under which Spanish diplomats had represented Japanese interests in this and other countries were thereby severed.

The official announcement of the Spanish Government that its diplomatic missions withdraw as representatives of Japan was received by the Administration by telephone from Washington

coincident with the visit to Tule Lake Center of Capt. Antonio Martin, vice-consul of Spain, representing F. de Amat, Spanish Consul at San Francisco, as Protecting Power Delegate.

Capt. Martin left the colony immediately upon receipt of the official order and telegraphed the Spanish Embassy in Washington that his mission in Tule Lake was completed. The Spanish Delegate had come to Tule Lake Friday from San Francisco, accompanied by Charles Eberhardt and Dr. Augusta Wagner, both of the U. S. Department of State.

Information available here after receipt of the Spanish announcement was that the only two other neutral countries in a position to represent Japan in the U. S.--Switzerland, which is the U. S. representative in Japan, and Sweden--had said they lacked sufficient personnel to undertake the task.

Newspaper dispatches from Washington and Madrid said the Spanish Government withdrawal was precipitated by the deaths of 172 Spanish nationals in Manila while in the hands of the Japanese army, regarding which Madrid had protested to Tokyo.

### 9 SENTENCED ON CHARGES OF VIOLATING REGULATIONS

Nine more men were sentenced to jail after project hearings during the past week on charges of violating the Special Project Regulations, which were put into effect on Mar. 16, the Administration announced today.

All of the men tried and sentenced during the past week were charged with violations of Regulations No. 2, No. 4, and No. 10, on from three to nine separate occasions, with sentences ranging from 270 to 360 days in jail, with varying portions to be suspended under terms of probation continuing for one year.

The defendants were told by Harry Black, project hearing officer, that the regulations are not aimed at the private opinions or inner feelings of the people who live quietly, but only at "a small minority which is creating a disturbance."

## PEACE OFFICE HANDLES 167 CASES IN 3 MONTHS

The Colonial Peace Headquarters this week disclosed that the total number of cases reported during January, February, and March is 167, which is 30 per cent less than during the same period of last year. During this three-month period, six were given trials, found guilty, and sentenced to immediate imprisonment.

Breakdown of the cases by months follows:

January--three burglaries, three thefts, three drunk, one miscellaneous, 27 lost, 22 found, and two fires.

February--one burglary, two thefts, one drunk, three disturbance of peace, one assault, 24 lost, 40 found, one mental case, two arrests, one injury, and one fire.

March--two burglaries, one theft, two drunk,

## 91,000 POUNDS OF PORK PRODUCED

Dressed pork totaling 91,000 pounds, 11,000 pounds of sausage, and 26,000 pounds of lard were produced during the Jan. 1-Mar. 25 period, Toward Jarrett, farm head, disclosed this morning.

Six hundred hogs were slaughtered during this same period, and the livestock inventory now reads 1350 heads, he said.

## BIRTH CERTIFICATES TO OBTAIN WORK

Special clearance is no longer necessary for employment in essential war industries, but in most cases birth certificates are required by the Nisei, according to a notice received by the Administration from the Chicago WRA Office.

Most of the placements are being made with employers having Army and Navy contracts. These employers cannot hire without evidence of birth place and date. WRA identification cards were acceptable, but since they are no longer issued, birth certificates are the best evidence. Ordinarily, identification papers which Issei must carry are sufficient.
