## JUSTICE DEPT.

### 18 TRANSFERRED TO CRYSTAL CITY

Eighteen persons were transferred Tuesday, the Administration announced, from Tule Lake Center to the Department of Justice internment camp at Crystal City, Texas.

The transfers were arranged by the Department of Justice, which notified the Administration they had been authorized and sent employees of the Immigration and Naturalization Service to escort the transferees, mostly women and small children, to Crystal City.

## CLAIMS AGAINST YOKOHAMA SPECIE BANK, LTD. ASKED

Persons, firms, and corporations having claims against the Yokohama Specie Bank, Ltd., San Francisco, or against its branch in Los Angeles must present them on or before Oct. 1 if they are to participate in the first distributions, according to a notice received this week by the Administration from Benjamin Corlett, Superintendent of Banks of the State of California, in charge of the business and affairs of the Yokohama Specie Bank, Ltd., in San Francisco, and its branch in Los Angeles, now in course of liquidation.

Claims must be presented in writing, in the English language, on forms which will be provided on request, and must be verified by the claimant or his duly authorized agent.

Communications regarding claims against the San Francisco bank should be addressed to the Yokohama Specie Bank, Ltd., in Liquidation, in care of the State Banking Department, 111 Sutter Street, San Francisco. If the claim is based on transactions with the Los Angeles branch, it should be directed to the Yokohama Specie Bank, Ltd., care of the State

Banking Department, 215 West Sixth Street, Los Angeles.

George Mills, special deputy, in a letter accompanying the formal notification, urged that persons with claims notify the State Banking Department at one or the other addresses of their present whereabouts so that proper forms may be furnished them.

Having been in Tule Lake earlier this year in connection with State Banking Department business, Mills is known personally to many of the claimants.

## WOMAN TAKES OWN LIFE WITH POISON

Umeno Yamada, 44 years old, wife of Yoichi Yamada, 5917-B, died Tuesday forenoon while being taken from her home to the hospital by ambulance. A bottle with a poison label was found in Mrs. Yamada's apartment by neighbors who found her dying and summoned aid. She left a note for her husband indicating she had taken her own life.

The investigation to determine the specific cause of Mrs. Yamada's death has not been completed.

## PROTECTION OF RIGHTS, PRIVILEGES IS SOUGHT

In an address before a recent meeting of the sheriffs of California, Robert Kenny, state attorney general, reiterated the duty and the determination of the law enforcement agencies to protect the rights and the privileges of Japanese Americans.

Referring to the San Francisco Conference as drawing many hundreds of foreign leaders, Kenny said, "these visitors will hear the story of democracy, the story of equality among men. They will be working out the machinery to build a world democracy and a perpetual equality among men and nations." "This democracy", he declared, "must be demonstrated to include Japanese Americans."

"With the determination by the War Department that military necessity no longer requires the exclusion of the Japanese Americans from the West Coast," he said, "and the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States that the rights of the Japanese Americans must be restored, these rights again are theirs. Remember--and remind people---that this applies only to those whose loyalty to these United States has been determined and who are hence being allowed to leave the War Relocation camps. These rights are meaningful, and must be protected. And it is the duty of law enforcement officials to cast aside any personal prejudices they may have and fully to protect the returning Japanese Americans."

not stop with prevention of shooting. The protection of their basic rights ---freedom from fear, freedom to earn their living, freedom to live as peaceful citizens---must also be maintained."

"This situation is a peculiar one in which many groups need to cooperate whole-heartedly to assure results. The sheriffs... the police chiefs... the Department of Justice... the armed services... the War Relocation Authority... the district attorneys and all of us, as adults and as responsible members of our communities, to do whatever we can to see that the attitudes, too, of people are such as to allow the Japanese Americans to live in safety and peace in the areas which they resettle."

## JURY CLEARS 3 ACCUSED OF RAID ON DOI FARM HOME

Auburn, Apr. 24--Three men, charged with attempting to burn and dynamite the ranch property of Sumio Doi, Nisei farmer, shortly after his return from a Japanese relocation center last January, were acquitted here today.

Defense attorneys produced no defense witnesses and offered no rebuttal of prosecution charges that the three men, James Edward Watson and two soldiers, Privates Alvin and Elmer Johnson had conducted terror raids against the ranch home of the returned Japanese American.

Floyd Bowers, defense attorney, argued: "This is a white man's country" and

The family, consisting of mother and three daughters, went to Denver, and the two couples went to San Francisco. The others went to carry out resettlement plans in Berkeley, Palo Alto, Los Angeles, Spokane, Salt Lake City and New York City.

One of the couples, Mr. and Mrs. Saburo Umezu arranged for permanent relocation after returning from a short-term leave to San Francisco.

When they departed last week Mrs. Umezu left a letter for her friends in the colony which reads:

"Dear Friends;

"Just a few words to express my grateful thanks for the many courtesies extended me during my residence here.

"I have enjoyed working with the Catholic Church very much. Now that the time has come for me to leave, I will miss all the friends here but will always remember the kind deeds of you all. I hope you all good luck and happiness.

"Thank you,

/S/ "Lilita Umezu."

Evacuee property services of WRA, formerly directed jointly by the Administrative Management Division in Washington and the San Francisco field office, have now become the responsibility of the Relocation Division. Dillon Myer, WRA director, has announced.

In accordance with this change, R. R. Best, project director, this week announced transfer of the Tule Lake Evacuee Property Section from the Administrative Management Division to the Relocation Division.

This change is part of a general realignment of basic functions under which West Coast area relocation offices in California, Arizona, Washington, and Oregon will report directly to the Relocation Division in Washington. The Assistant Director in San Francisco, reporting directly to the Director, will coordinate the problems of WRA over the entire West Coast in dealing with state and federal officials, including the military; will coordinate public relations; and in general expedite established policies and procedures of the WRA.

## **HOSTELS MAY GET HELP FROM WRA**

In order to aid in solving the problem of temporary, emergency housing for evacuees returning to the West Coast, the Administration has announced that the WRA has set up a plan under which it will loan certain equipment to responsible organizations for establishment of hostels in California, Oregon, and Washington for evacuee use.

Hostels under this plan must provide accommodations for a minimum of 20 persons. The sponsors must agree that the hostels will be operated on a non-profit basis and that they will be open for inspection by WRA employees to insure that facilities are utilized properly. Tenancy would be limited to not more than three weeks except in hardship cases.

Equipment available to be loaned for use in such hostels includes beds, mattresses, blankets, pillows, straight chairs, kitchen utensils, crockery, and cutlery.

Hostels may be sponsored and supervised by responsible committees or representative groups of people other than evacuees or in addition to evacuees with approval of the area supervisor of the area in which the hostels are to be located. Proposals arising at centers will be transmitted to the area supervisors.

# RECS NIP SEAGULLS TO TAKE "AA" CAGE TITLE

Fighting off the last minute challenge of the favored Seagull five, the Recs emerged on the long end of a 32 to 30 score to capture the coveted Tule Lake "AA" Basketball Championship last Thursday night at the local gym. The crucial fracas saw 31 personal fouls committed by both squads.

The tide of battle was decided in the last few seconds when Isa Ota, the lone Rec substitute, sank a long one-handed pusher from the side to take the lead from the Seagulls. With seconds to go in the last half, Morio Hada missed a heart-breaking shot that just rolled out to climax the last bid of the Seagulls.

By displaying a smooth working offense the Recs managed to remain a jump ahead of the determined Seagulls throughout most of the fracas. Hitoshi Ota with seven digits and Angel Kagiama, who swished in four field goals for a total of eight points, led the Recs' attack. At half-time, the Recs were ahead by the score of 17 to 14.

Undaunted by the nine-point lead garnered by the Recs early in the second half, the fighting Seagulls under the leadership of the famed back board artist, George Goto, came back strong to even up the count. Deadly Aki Hada and Morio Hada hit the hoop for six digits apiece to aid in the comeback.

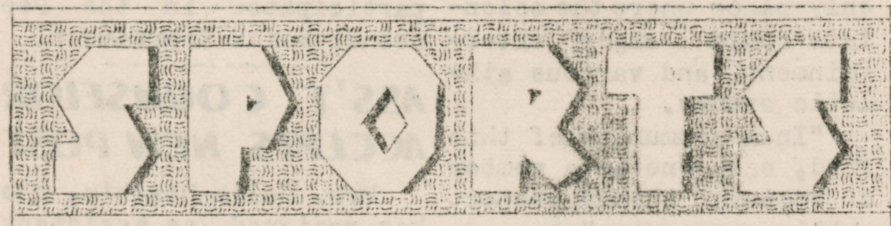
Goto tapped in 13 digits to cop high point honors in the playoff.

# OTA WINS "AA" SCORING TITLE

に汚毒があつても、周囲即ち身体氣候其他の境遇事情が之を刺激しなけれは、それが發露して病氣となるものではない、りません。又、いくら周囲の刺激が強くても、若し元來自分の心に汚毒がなかつたならば無論ふき出さず、病氣となるべき苦はありません。で病氣が起つたら一方に於ては、自分の心の汚毒、即ち業の恐るべきを悲しみ、一方には周囲の刺激、即ち如來の御方便の有り難いことを喜ばねばなりません。
