MI SEASON OPENS TOMO

WAR DEPT. 442ND MAKES RIG LAINS IN TALY

WASHINGTON, May 3--The U. S. War Department today issued a special announcement identifying the 442nd Infantry Regiment, composed of Japanese American fighting men, as in the vanguard the drive which has smashed the Germans in Italy.

"Members of the 442nd Infantry Regiment, composed of American doughboys of Japanese descent," said the War Department announcement, "are in the vanguard of the Fifth Army's great offensive which has smashed the German army in Northern Italy. Making sensational gains of 176 miles in five days, the 442nd took part in the capture of Genoa, Italy's largest seaport, on Apr. 27, and then forged ahead to enter Turin, last great city in the Po River Valley, on Apr. 30. The 442nd entered Genoa along with the 473rd Infantry Regiment, which then swung (cont'd on page 2)


