

## BASEBALL SEASON OPENS TOMORROW

### WAR DEPT.

### 442ND MAKES BIG GAINS IN ITALY

WASHINGTON, May 3--The U. S. War Department today issued a special announcement identifying the 442nd Infantry Regiment, composed of Japanese American fighting men, as in the vanguard of the drive which has smashed the Germans in Italy.

"Members of the 442nd Infantry Regiment, composed of American doughboys of Japanese descent," said the War Department announcement, "are in the vanguard of the Fifth Army's great offensive which has smashed the German army in Northern Italy. Making sensational gains of 176 miles in five days, the 442nd took part in the capture of Genoa, Italy's largest seaport, on Apr. 27, and then forged ahead to enter Turin, last great city in the Po River Valley, on Apr. 30. The 442nd entered Genoa along with the 473rd Infantry Regiment, which then swung

T/Sgt. Yoshio Imoto, son of Uichi and Tsuru Imoto, 3813-A, was wounded in Italy on Apr. 14.

Pvt. George Iwamoto, son of Masaru and Shizuko Iwamoto, 1301-B, was wounded in Italy on Apr. 5.

### WATER SYSTEM BEING RUSHED

Homer Ricketts, senior engineer, today announced that if cooperation is received from the residents and the workers, the irrigation project will be completed within a month. An approval to complete the center irrigation system, was received from the Washington office last week.

Since the irrigation system will furnish water only to the main lateral lines, it is up to the residents to draw the water into their own blocks.

## CENTER FIREMEN HELP QUELL TULE LAKE FIRE

Tule Lake Center's efficient fire department early Wednesday morning helped save the town of Tulelake, nine miles from here, from a potentially disastrous fire which destroyed the Homestead Cafe, one of the town's earliest buildings, and scorched and broke windows in the Warren Hotel, immediately adjacent.

Bruce Brickel, chief of the Tulelake town volunteer fire department, appealed by telephone for aid shortly after 2 a.m. as the flames were raging out of control.

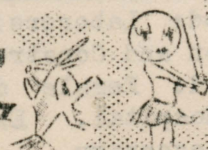
Nine evacuee fire fighters of Tule Lake Center's department sped to the town

of Tulelake in a fire truck, accompanied by Samuel Owen, Tule Lake Center fire chief, and George Carver, assistant chief. They laid and operated 900 feet of hoses in co-operating with the volunteer firemen and a fire crew sent from Merrill, Ore.

Fire Chief Brickel complimented the evacuee firemen on their efficiency and smooth system of operation.

"Those boys certainly know how to go about it," he told Chief Owen as the water streams plunged into the heart of the fire a few moments after the Tule Lake Center truck arrived.

## WATER SHORTAGE PREDICTED UNLESS SUPPLY CONSERVED

Because the ground water supply now faces depletion due to over consumption of water in this center, the Engineering Section today asked residents to refrain from using tap water in their gardens and from using unnecessary water.

The capacity of the ground water supply is estimated at 2,000,000 gallons per day, but camp consumption has exceeded that mark.

If the residents continue to use too much water, the well may run dry, it was stated.

Due to the increase in the point values of meats, oils, fats, and dairy products, Mess Operations will discontinue issuing food for special parties so that colonists may receive their full allowance of food, stated Raymond Hayward, chief project steward, today.



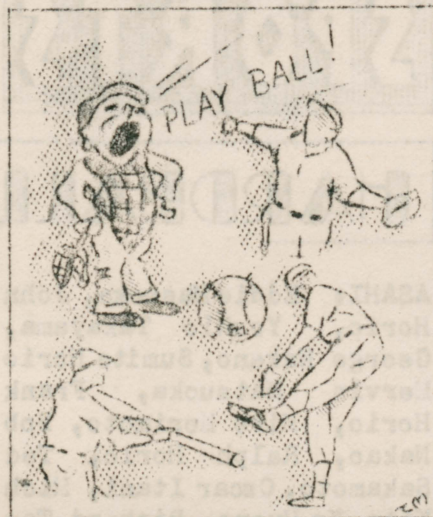
