4 WRA OFFICIALS VEGETABLES-97 ACRES- HERE ON VISIT PLANTED IN 4 WEEKS

Several WRA officials from Washington are visiting Tule Lake Center this week, according to the Administration.

John Provinse, chief of the Community Management Division, is due to arrive here today or tomorrow for an official visit.

Those here include the following:

Allan Markley, information specialist of the Reports Division; Robert Dalins, Relocation Division assistant centers liaison officer; Vera McCord, public welfare consultant, and Gertrude Wetzel, assistant head nurse.

During the past four weeks of favorable weather, the Farm Section planted 97 acres of vegetables and 300 acres of barley, Toward Jarrett, chief of agriculture, stated today.

Vegetables planted and their acreage follows: Onions, 21; radishes, 13; china peas, 12; gobo, 12; nappa, 10; beets, 5; carrots, 5; lettuce, 5; turnips, 5; daikon, 4; garlic, 2; shingiku, 2; spinach, 2; mustard green, 1.

Planting of 150 acres of potato began last week, 50 acres of which have already been planted, stated Jarrett.

During the month of April, 30,386 pounds of

Pfc. Hisaya Hasegawa, nephew of Shimasuke Maruyama, 703-C, wounded in European theater of operations.

TREASURY DEPARTMENT MOVE AIDS RESETTLERS

To aid the WRA resettlement program, the Treasury Department has informed WRA that blocked accounts of but a limited number of evacuees on the Army Free List may be unblocked.

Requests for unblocking orders will be forwarded through the project director to the Federal Reserve Bank in San Francisco. The bank will determine whether the statements on the individual request forms are correct, and if they are, the individual unblocking

orders will be returned in care of the project director, and private banks will be notified of the action.

Evacuees in four categories are not eligible to apply for unblocking orders through this special arrangement with the treasury. They are persons not on the Army Free List, persons who have been issued specific blocking orders, evacuees who have represented or acted as agents for any person outside the continental United States on or since July 26, 1941, and persons who now hold funds belonging to blocked nationals.

Those who are not eligible, however, may apply for reconsideration of their cases by filing Form TFU-1 with the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco.

Business enterprises may apply for unblocking through the same procedure. Unblocked persons and business enterprises are subject to specific reporting and other requirements.

Individuals who may be denied unblocking orders still will be allowed to withdraw sufficient funds

REGISTRATION FOR NEW TERM TO START MAY 14

Second semester registration for Tri-State High School will open on Monday, May 14, and will continue until Saturday, May 19, at the Attendance Office for persons wishing to re-enter or for those desiring to

enroll as postgraduates, according to Guy Cook, principal.

Courses that may be taken include advanced algebra, physiology, English 4, sociology, solid geometry, trigonometry, and typing in the morning; physics, English 4, U.S. history, economics, sociology, shorthand land 2, and typing in the afternoon; auto mechanics courses in the morning and afternoon.

The second semester begins on May 28 and ends on Oct. 19. There will be a between-quarter vacation from Aug. 6 to 10.

FUNDS PROVIDED FOR ASSISTANCE

Additional WRA funds amounting to \$175,000 are now available for the Social Security Board's Resettlement Assistance Program through a transfer authorization bill signed by President Harry Truman on Apr. 26, announced Dillon Myer, national director of the WRA, this week.

Accelerated resettlement from WRA centers, Mr. Myer said, had exhausted the \$50,000 originally set aside to provide outside assistance during the 1945 fiscal year. The diverted funds will be available for minimum assistance through June 30, 1945, to resettling evacuees in the greatest need, the director said.

to allow them to relocate, the Treasury Department said. Former internees whose accounts remain blocked may upon application withdraw up to \$200 a month for living expenses, and other persons whose accounts are not unblocked may withdraw as much as \$500 a month. Any blocked person or enterprise may apply for a special license which will permit sufficiently free use of funds to conduct business.

Application forms and information regarding unblocking of funds are available through the office of the Project Attorney.

NEXT SHOE STAMP PERIOD, AUG 1

The next regular shoe stamp will be issued on Aug. 1, the OPA advised the Social Welfare Section this week. This statement was in line with a previous announcement of the OPA to holders of ration books outside of centers that the shoe ration period had been extended to Aug. 1, instead of validation of the stamp on May 1, as had been expected.

Application procedure of center residents for shoe stamps will be announced prior to the validation date, it was announced.

ALL DRIVERS MUST HEED SPEED LIMIT

Strict adherence to the general speed limit of 15 miles per hour was asked by the Colonial Peace Headquarters at 1808 today.

Speeding is not only a violation of the law, the department stated, but it creates unnecessary dust and it endangers the lives of many residents, particularly when vehicles are driven through the blocks.

ACTION TAKEN ON CASUALTY LIST SCHEMES

The War Department has warned that next of kin of war heroes should guard against fraudulent schemes based on casualty lists, and the United States Post Office has announced it is taking vigorous action in all such cases involving illegal use of the mails.

One of the commonest forms of such swindles involves a letter to the next of kin to battle casualties, advising that the soldier is to be given a special niche in a so-called "hall of fame" or a "hero's memorial book," with deposits in advance required. As soon as the remittance is received the transaction is closed, and the American fighting man's family has been victimized.

MOVIE STAR WANTS DOMESTIC WORKERS

Hollywood is putting in its bid for persons planning to resettle from Tule Lake Center.

Franchot Tone, motion picture actor, and his wife have informed the Administration that they are seeking three people to operate their domestic establishment. They will pay \$200 to \$250 per month for a couple, and \$125 to \$150 per month for a maid to care for their small children with excellent living quarters and maintenance furnished.

"We wish to assure you," Goldberg said, "that the same equal treatment will be accorded any loyal person of Japanese ancestry who wishes to enter this industry in any capacity whatsoever, whether in the retail or wholesale business, as is accorded to any person as long as they follow the rules and regulations of the union and industry."

1945 BASEBALL SEASON STARTS

GUADALUPE TROUNCES T.L. NIPPON, 12-6, IN OPENER

Approximately 2500 fans were on hand Saturday at Field #3 to welcome in the 1945 Tule Lake baseball season. Showing some of the spirit that made them champions of 1944, Guadalupe handed the T.L. Nippons a 12 to 6 lacing, in the official league opener.

Preceding the initial contest, an opening ceremony (nyujoshiki) was held. All eight teams vying for the "A" league crown, appeared on the diamond in full uniform. Project Director R.R. Best gave a brief principal address, concluding with, "Be kind to the umpires and may the best team win". Masamori Maruyama, assistant supervisor of Community Activities, emceed the affair.

During the ceremony, a beautifully decorated maroon banner to be presented to the champions this season by the Poster Department, was displayed to the fans.

The traditional ball throwing ceremony initiated the new season.

GUADALUPE RALLIES EARLY

A bad case of fumbleitis enabled the T.L. Nippons to draw first blood in the opening stanza when lead-off man Shiz Kawano and Mits Domen spiked rubber in one-two fashion. Kawano crossed home on Step Tomooka's wild pitch, while Domen annexed another tally when Masao Iriyama, Guadalupe short Patcher, fumbled a difficult ball hit by Joe Shimada.

However, T.L. Nippons' glory was short-lived. When the Guadalupe boys came to bat they went on a scoring rampage, knocking two T.L. Nippon hurlers, Yosh Negi and Yosh Shimada, out of the box. Reliable Motoo Tsuda came to the rescue late in the third stanza, but by that time the powerful 1944 titlists had amassed a cool 10 counters. Ace stick wielder Masao Iriyamawas the biggest nemesis to Tsujita men; he drove in a total of six runs during the batting spree and enjoyed a perfect day at the plate with three for three. Keystone sacker Kei Nishino topped all batters getting four hits in as many trip to the plate. Guadalupe added two more points for good measure in the eighth inning.

In the fifth chukker T. L. Nippons' attempt to start a rally bogged down, after catcher Johnny Kimoto and Roy Kurahara succeeded in rounding the bases. Joe Shimada was left stranded in scoring position when Motoo Tsuda

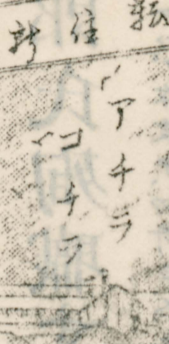
