RECORD RAINFALL REGISTERED

By totaling 4.12 inches, precipitation during the month of May in this area broke all previous records kept by the Tulalake Reclamation Bureau Office. Rainfall in May has averaged 1.37 inches.

The previous high of 1.75 inches was recorded in 1935. Most arid May, according to the bureau, was in 1938 when rain fell .13 inches.

FIRST NISEI TO DIE ON OKINAWA

Believed to be the first Nisei casualty from Tule Lake Center in the Okinawa campaign is T/4 Mitsuru Shibata, who was killed on Ie Jima on Apr. 23, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Kakuichi Shibata, 7411-D, have been notified.

TEST CASE FIGURE TO LIVE IN CHICAGO

Mitsuye Endo, who was the central figure in a test case in which the U.S. Supreme Court determined that the government had no right to confine loyal Americans of Japanese ancestry in war relocation centers, will live with her sister, Mrs. George Yamamoto, in Chicago, instead of California, according to authorities of the Topaz Relocation Center.

MAY REPORT

FIRST HARVEST OF 1945 SEASON MADE ON FARM

Despite rainy weather, the Farm Section harvested 24,570 pounds of vegetables and completed planting most of the major crops in May, according to the monthly report released by Toward Jarrett, chief of Agriculture.

The first harvest of the season yielded 23,520 pounds of green onions and 1050 pounds of radishes.

Major crops planted were 150 acres of potatoes, 22 acres of onions, 16 acres of radishes, 12 acres of gobo, and 10 acres of nappa.

The Livestock Unit produced and delivered 41,285 pounds of dressed pork, 4178 pounds of sausage, and

10,030 pounds of lard to Mess Operations.

Five hundred and fifty-seven hogs were purchased during May, bringing the total on hand to 1362 heads.

FOOD COMMITTEE TO BE ELECTED

Plans are being made, Raymond Hayward, chief project steward, announced today, to elect a colony Food Committee by popular vote.

Two elections will be held, both the latter part of this month, according to present plans.

First will be a "primary" election in which a Food Committee candidate will be selected by popular vote in each block. Then each ward, in a second election, also by popular vote, will select one of the block candidates to be its representative on the Food Committee.

Heretofore, Food Committee members have been named in Mess Operations.

DOUBT CONSTITUTIONALITY OF 2 SECTIONS OF NEW LAW

128 CASES DURING
2-MONTH PERIOD

The WRA Solicitor's Office in Washington, in a recently prepared analysis, has expressed the opinion that two sections of Oregon's new Alien Land Law are "of very doubtful constitutionality."

"The new Oregon law... does not change... the prohibitions of the alien land law (1921) but merely provides a new penalty and... sets up certain presumptions of evidence," Edwin Ferguson, solicitor, stated.

If an alien evacuee wishes to return to Oregon as a farm laborer, or to live and work on, or to manage land owned by his children or other citizens, there is no reason why he should not do so, Ferguson said. He should be able, however, to furnish evidence that he has no interest in the land if he is called upon to do so by Oregon Law-enforcement officials.

EX-TULEAN DIES IN OKINAWA CAMPAIGN

The first Nisei soldier to die in action in the battle for Okinawa was a former Tulean, T/3 Eddie Fukui, a War Department notification to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Shuichi Fukui of Burley, Idaho, has revealed.

T/3 Fukui was one of the first to enlist in the U.S. Army from Tule Lake Center in 1942. Overseas since Feb., 1944, he had been through the battles of Guam and Leyte before participating in the Okinawa campaign.

The solicitor advised that such evidence may be in the form of powers of attorney or employment contracts making it clear that any compensation is for services rendered and that it is not dependent on the crops produced. Where the alien manages the operations on behalf of the owner, the agreement should be supplemented by accurate and complete records. To show that he is actually an agent and not a share cropper, tenant or owner, he should have bank accounts, sales receipts and expense statements that clearly reflect this to be the case.

The Colonial Peace Department will examine the licenses of all the dogs and cats of this center in order to comply with Army instructions, the department announced this week.

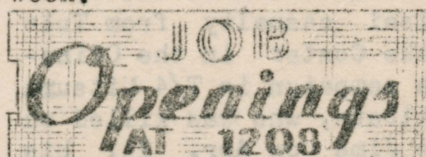
A special investigator will go to each block to examine the licenses, it was stated.

A breakdown of these cases showed two assaults, four burglaries, eight thefts, three disorderly conduct, two suicide attempts, two arrests, one mental case, one vehicle accident, and the rest, lost and found reports.

They laid flowers on the graves, and then listened to five ministers of different faiths who spoke to the assemblage from the base of the memorial tower in the center of the Japanese section of the cemetery.

The ministers were the Rev. Sohei Kowta, the Rev. Kanmo Imamura, the Rev. Tomoki Iwanaga, the Rev. Joiehi G. Yahiro, the Rev. Frank Masahiro Omi.

All Japanese graves were found to be in perfect order. Throughout the war they received the same care as the graves of the dead of other ancestries. Neatly clipped grass surrounds the headstones, most of which have both Japanese and English inscriptions.

Old acquaintances were renewed by some who had not seen each other since 1942.

TULE LAKE NIPPONS BOP MANZANAR SQUAD, 8-2

Displaying scoring punch as of old, the Tule Lake Nippons outclassed the floundering Manzanar Squad Sunday, whipping them to the lopsided tune of 8 to 2.

Motoco Tsuda was credited with the triumph, holding the opposition at bay most of the way with four stingy hits, but allowed eight walks. Curve ball specialist Jimmie Tamura toed the rubber for the vanquished nine only to be relieved in the eighth canto by Tom Kiriu, after yielding 11 blows.

The victorious nine began collecting their digits in the initial stanza. Mits Domon and Johnny Kimoto scored on Roy Kurahara's bingle to left and Keizo Komura's sacrifice, respectively. Other Tule Lake Nippon scores were fashioned in the fourth and in the last three chukkers.

Catcher Kimoto proved a nemesis to the Manzanar team, enjoying a perfect day at the plate with three for three. He caused most damage in the eighth frame batting in two runs with a terrific line drive to left.
