CO-OP OFFERS REWARD OF \$300

Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises, Inc., this week put out notices offering a reward of \$300 for information leading to arrest and conviction of the person or persons guilty of stealing \$3359.25 from a safe in the cooperative business office at 717 on or about June 25.

The conditions of the reward, as offered by the cooperative and approved by the Administration, are as follows:

1. Information must be reported to the Chief of Internal Security or anyone whom he may designate.
2. No member of the Administrative Police of Tule Lake Center shall be eligible to receive the reward.
3. No officer or member of the Board of Directors of the cooperative shall be eligible to receive the reward.

4. The Project Director, the Assistant Project Director in charge of Community Management and the Chief of Internal Security shall have the whole discretion of deciding to whom the reward shall be paid, and upon payment of the reward by the cooperative after such decision, there shall be no further liability in connection with this offer of reward on the part of the cooperative to any other person or persons who may have furnished information or assisted in the apprehension and conviction of the guilty person or persons. OFFICIALS GIVE VIEWS ON CLOSING OF STORES

In a statement directed to all residents of Tule Lake Center, Harry Black, acting project director, said today that neither the Administration nor its Internal Security Section had suggested or agreed with the action of Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises, Inc., in closing its canteens in connection with investigation of loss of \$3359.25 from one of the safes in its business office at 717.

The cooperative published an announcement Monday that the canteens would be closed until July 9, at which time newly elected and former directors were to hold a joint meeting. At the same time it was announced that Treasurer I. Ishiyama, General Manager K. Takizawa, Executive Secretary K. Kimura, Assistant

Executive Secretary H. Fujimoto and Personnel Director Y. Tsujimura had submitted their resignations.

MOVE MADE AGAINST ADVICE

"Not only did the Administration not suggest closing of the canteens, this move was made against the advice of Administration officers," said the Acting Project Director. "Officials of the cooperative have been told that the Administration considers the action of closing of canteens a grave error in judgment on their part, and these officials were urged at that time to take immediate and effective action to reopen the canteens."

"The Administration has no desire or intention to interfere in the conduct of Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises, Inc., as long as the cooperative is operated in accordance with its agreement with the Administration and for the benefit of the colony as a whole, but it is interested vitally in orderly conduct of all affairs of the center as they affect the people."

"The canteens provide the center residents with their only direct means of

SKELETON REMAINS OF YOUNG INDIAN FOUND AT BLK. 51

Twenty pieces of human skeleton remains were discovered in Block 51 last week by Taichiro Hirashima of 5115-E while he was digging an irrigation ditch near his barrack, according to Colonial Peace Headquarters. The findings are now in possession of Internal Security and are described as very old and in crumbling condition.

Dr. Marvin Opler, an anthropologist, who formerly taught at University of Colorado and Reed College, identified the skull, which was unearthed approximately 18 inches below the surface, as that of an immature Indian male. He stated that if the remains had been uncovered more carefully, they may have had some historical value.

"If any more human remains are found, residents should leave them undisturbed and contact me at 701-B for they may prove valuable to the California Historical Society," Opler said.

Information turned over to the Chief of Internal Security or his representative will be held in strict confidence.

SEMI-ANNUAL FIRE REPORT RELEASED

Damages by fire during the Jan. 1-July 1 period totaled \$1918.83, according to the semi-annual report released by Samuel Owen, fire protection officer.

The greatest loss occurred in June when a farm warehouse housing two trucks and a tractor was destroyed. Damage at this fire was placed at \$1752.90.

HOUSING ADJUSTMENTS NECESSARY SAYS THOMAS

Joe Thomas, administrative officer in charge of housing, announced today that adjustments in colony housing which are now under way are being made by authority of an order issued July 21, 1944, by R. R. Best, project director.

"The Housing Unit of Tule Lake Center is hereby authorized by me to make whatever adjustments necessary to bring about fair and equal distribution of living space in the residential area of the colony," Thomas quoted Best's order as saying.

Adjustments under authority of this order are necessary at this time, Thomas said, because numerous people have recently left the center and housing distribution has been thrown out of balance, with some families and individuals occupying more and some less than the amount of space to which they are entitled if everyone is to be treated on a fair and impartial basis.

Generally speaking, families are allowed, under

CREDITORS ASKED TO FILE CLAIMS

Louis Noyes, project attorney, said this week he has received notice from the attorney for W. W. Gray, assignee for the benefit of the creditors of the estate of Rikimaru Brothers and Company of Los Angeles, fruit and produce commission merchants, that the estate has been liquidated, and that Gray now is in a position to make distribution of assets to the creditors.

The assets were assigned to Gray at the outbreak of the war, to be liquidated for the benefit of the creditors, some of whom are residents of Tule Lake Center.

obtaining many necessities, and the officials of the cooperative have been told that the Administration considers the closing not only as working an unjustifiable hardship on the people, but also as endangering the economic stability of Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises, Inc., in that while the canteens are inoperative, contacts with vendors may be lost, and the buying power and efficiency of the cooperative in serving the colony thus impaired. Many people also have been put out of work.

CLOSING NOT JUSTIFIABLE

"Officials of the cooperative have stated that the closing was ordered to accelerate or facilitate the investigation of the money loss. These officials have been told that in the opinion of the Administration, the closure not only has not this effect, but that it actually has hampered the investigation. The closing is not justifiable by apprehension that more money may be lost. The missing money was not lost from any of the canteens. It was lost from a safe in the business office at 717, and while the canteens have been closed, this business office has remained open."

DEWITT MAKES STATEMENT

Joseph DeWitt, chief of Internal Security, in another statement took exception to the announcement of cooperative officials that "if the proceeds from the daily sales of the

FARM PRODUCE 250,545 POUNDS

In June, the project farm yielded 250,545 pounds of vegetables for center consumption, according to the monthly report just released by Toward Jarrett, chief of Agriculture.

Some of the major crops harvested last month were 102,965 pounds of nappa, 92,315 pounds of radish, 25,200 pounds of daikon, and 16,275 pounds of spinach. With the over-all picture of vegetables reported as good, heavy harvesting is expected during the coming months.

stores are to be kept in the same safe, the persons responsible for the safes cannot possibly continue to assume the responsibility," and that "in addition it has been requested of Internal Security that the investigation be completed within a short period."

"The safe from which the \$3359.25 was lost is not involved in the safekeeping of any funds of the cooperative," said DeWitt, "and this fact was stated by officials of the cooperative at the time the loss was discovered—that this safe was used exclusively for the convenience of organizations and individuals who left money in the cooperative's care, and was not used for deposit of any money belonging to the cooperative itself."

"Further, it is not necessary for anyone, including officials of the cooperative, to ask Internal Security to expedite investigation of a crime that has been committed. That is Internal Security's business. The loss of the money is being investigated by police methods, and the investigation will continue as long as it is necessary for it to continue in order for the guilty person or persons to be found and punished. It will not be possible to keep cooperative officials or anyone else informed of day by day progress, of who is being investigated or in what manner they are being investigated, if the case is to be solved."
