ACTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS COMMENDED

Action of the Board of Directors of Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises, Inc., in reopening the canteens last Monday was commended today by Harry Black, acting project director.

Black also commented that the decision of the board and of the executives that the present executive management personnel continue to serve until investigation of loss of \$3359.25 from a business office safe is completed, is a wise one in the opinion of the Administration.

The newly elected and re-elected directors at a meeting Sunday declined to accept the previously tendered resignations of I. Ishiyama, treasurer; K. Takizawa, general manager; K. Kimura, executive secretary; H. Fujimoto, assistant executive secretary; and Y. Tsujimura, personnel director.

42 RELOCATE IN JUNE FROM HERE

Forty-two Tule Lake residents, including eight basic family units, left the center during June to resettle in various parts of the U. S., the Relocation Division announced today.

The majority of those leaving went to the East and Midwest. All either had jobs or business interests arranged before leaving the center or established themselves in a means of livelihood almost immediately after arriving at their destinations. The job opportunities lists at the Relocation Office aided many of them in obtaining desirable work connections, said William Holland, relocation program officer, and where necessary, further aid was given by WRA field offices at the destinations.

"The action of the board in reopening the canteens earlier than had at first been contemplated, and the willingness of these executives to continue their service pending solution of the cooperative's present difficulty are commendable," said the Acting Project Director, "and the Administration believes both will be of aid in bringing about satisfactory solution of this case."

Joseph DeWitt, chief of Internal Security, who is in charge of the investigation, said progress has been made toward tracking down the missing money, and that if people in the colony who have helpful knowledge in their possession will give this in confidence to Internal Security, a solution may be expected shortly. It is important, he said, that some as yet missing information be brought to light by the people possessing it.

ADDITIONAL PUMP BEING INSTALLED

In order to supply more irrigation water into the center, an additional pump, which will increase the present output by one-third, is being installed at the "J" canal, it was announced by Irrigation Unit today.

The new lateral being laid between Ward I and Ward V will receive this additional supply of water and will furnish Ward I and Ward II with more water.

Irrigation water will be run on schedule as soon as the irrigation system is completed this week.

ASSURANCE GIVEN THOSE QUITTING 3 ORGANIZATIONS

To people who are withdrawing their memberships in Sokuji Kikoku Hoshi Dan, Hokoku Seinen Dan and Hokoku Joshi Seinen Dan, the Administration gave assurance today, through Harry Black, acting project director, that this will mean no adverse change in their residence status in Tule Lake.

"Many people are notifying us of their withdrawal from these organizations," said Black, "and we have knowledge that many others have been hesitating to do this because they have been misinformed; because they have been misled into believing that such membership is a guarantee of continued residence here and that if they withdraw they will be forced to go out."

"Those things definitely are not true. As has been stated many times before, WRA contemplates no forced relocation. It believes that people who are in a position to do so should resettle for their own good, and it will help them to do it. But the people must make up their own minds. While this is being done, the decision of many people who heretofore have been misled, to conduct their lives in peace and order is a happy one for the welfare of all within this center."

PURCHASE OF 170 HOGS ANNOUNCED

One hundred head of hogs purchased in June and 70 head bought last week from Klamath Falls brought the total number on hand to 1208, the Livestock Unit reported today.

Also announced was the delivery in June of 41,432 pounds of dressed pork, 6712 pounds of sausage, and 9723 pounds of lard to Mess Operations.

MESS 720 TICKETS TO BECOME VOID MONDAY

Effective Monday, July 16, all meal tickets to Mess 720 will be void, Harry Black, acting project director, announced this week. Persons having passes for meals at 720 and still needing to eat at a mess hall other than their own must have reissued passes for any one of four mess hall near the main gate--4, 40, 5 or 6.

Hot meals no longer will be served at Mess 720, but it will continue to prepare lunches to be sent outside, such as for the Motor Pool, Police Department, Fire Department, Tofu Factory, etc.

"It is to be borne in mind, however," said Black, "that no passes for extra meals will be issued to

anyone, unless it is imperative that they must report back to work by 1 o'clock sharp; otherwise, there is no reason why a person should be given a pass if he returns at the usual hour. It is also suggested special lunches may be prepared in their own mess halls for their consumption either in the offices or their places of work."

Requests for passes should be sent to the Mess Operations Office, Building 325, designating the preferred mess hall--4, 40, 5 or 6.

TO GIVE REWARD FOR INFORMATION

SACRAMENTO, July 13--Attorney General Robert Kenny announced at a recent meeting of the California Committee of Civic Unity here that rewards will be paid for information leading to arrest and conviction on felony charges of anyone attacking a person of Japanese ancestry in California.

The rewards will be paid by the American Civil Liberties Union, Attorney General Kenny said, because the state law does not allow use of public funds for such purpose. The identity of persons furnishing any such information will not be revealed, he said. The Attorney General told the Civic Unity group that incidents are on the wane, and that he believes the announcement of the rewards may curb them entirely.

"FICTION" SPREAD COZZENS CLAIMS

SAN FRANCISCO, July 13--R. B. Cozzens, assistant field director of the War Relocation Authority here, has charged in a statement that State Senators Jack Tenney of Los Angeles and Hugh Burns of Fresno spread "fearless falsehoods" about the WRA during the recent session of the California legislature.

Cozzens listed as "fictions" four statements included in a resolution introduced by Tenney and Burns--that the FBI and Army and Navy intelligence were not consulted on the character and integrity of persons of Japanese ancestry returning to the West Coast, that the first five Japanese returning to the coast had espionage records, that persons with "an open and notorious and well-known disloyal attitude" were being relocated on the coast, and that WRA had failed of proper care in its relocation work. The statements were stricken from the resolution before it was passed by the legislature.

He declared the firm's lease on a Stockton theater, although permissible when it was made in 1942 as there was a treaty existing between Japan and the U. S. at that time, now to be null and void.
