

MENINGITIS CASE

GREAT EFFORT MADE TO SAVE TULE BABY

The United States Navy and the Children's Hospital in San Francisco cooperated with the staff of Tule Lake's hospital this week in a dramatic effort to save the life of Ryoko Ogawa, 15-month-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Hatsuji Ogawa, 7602-B, stricken with meningitis caused by the virus of influenza.

The comparatively rare malady is nearly 100 per cent fatal except when it is possible to administer a special, newly developed serum, said Dr. Jack Sleath, Tule Lake principal medical officer, and even with

use of the serum, death occurs in 25 per cent of the cases.

DIES WEDNESDAY NIGHT

This was the case with little Ryoko, who died during Wednesday night despite the 75 per cent chance for life the Navy and two hospitals had given her.

When it became apparent that the baby was suffering from the deadly malady, it was found that the Children's Hospital in San Francisco possessed the nearest supply of the precious serum. Both the San Francisco hospital and the Navy unhesitatingly responded to an appeal for help from Dr. Sleath and Dr. Donnell Boardman, senior medical officer, both of whom were giving special attention to the case of little Ryoko.

SICK LEAVE RULES ARE CLARIFIED BY FINANCE OFFICE

Because it has noted that some misunderstanding exists among center residents regarding the new sick leave regulations which became effective May 1, the Finance Office today issued the following abstract of the regulations:

1. Workers are entitled to 15 days sick leave a work year which shall be credited to the worker as earned at the rate of one and one quarter days per month. Leave is credited at the beginning of each calendar month and is available for use at any time during that or any following month.

2. Sick leave is cumulative except that the balance to a worker's credit at the end of any month cannot exceed 30 days.

3. A worker employed continuously from May 1, 1944, to Apr. 30, 1945, will have 15 days sick leave on credit Apr. 30 minus any leave taken during the year. A worker employed since Jan. 1, 1945, will have five days sick leave to his credit Apr. 30, 1945, minus any leave taken prior to Apr. 30.

4. A worker who has been granted 15 days sick leave under prior regulations and who has been employed less than one year prior to May 1, 1945, will be overdrawn and leave earned during the subse-

quent months shall be credited against such overdrawn leave. In other words, a worker employed Jan. 1, 1945, who has been granted 15 days sick leave under prior regulations will be overdrawn 10 days on Apr. 30, 1945, and leave subsequently earned will be credited against this overdrawn leave.

5. Advance sick leave will not be granted.

6. Unused sick leave to the credit of a worker at time of separation may be reccredited to the worker at time of reassignment provided his separation was voluntary or due to reduction in force.

7. Apprentices and emergency or intermittent workers are not entitled to sick leave.

STATUS OF ALL STILL AVAILABLE

Last week's statement by Major General H. C. Pratt, commanding general of the Western Defense Command, explaining that the Army alone is responsible for determining what persons of Japanese ancestry may return to the Pacific Coast, does not alter the fact that WRA, while having nothing whatever to do with establishment of such status, is in possession of official information at all times regarding the status of all residents of Tule Lake Center, W.K. Holland, relocation program officer, said today, and this information is available on personal request at the Relocation Office.

The Relocation Office is in position to furnish information regarding any person's status not only on the Army lists, but on the Department of Justice and the Immigration and Naturalization Service lists, Holland explained, and anyone in doubt of his or her status may receive this information only by applying in person.

Information regarding procedure for appealing status classifications is also available at the Relocation Office.

An Army hearing and review board is sitting periodically in Tule Lake to consider appeal cases, but requests for such reviews must be made not to the board but through established channels direct to the Western Defense Command.

JULY

HARVEST YIELDS 372,580 POUNDS OF VEGETABLES

Eleven varieties of vegetables, totaling over 372,580 pounds, were harvested during the month of July by 275 men and 23 women, according to the monthly report released by Toward Jarrett, chief of Agriculture.

Daikon topped the list of vegetables harvested

with 103,580 pounds, while turnip with 92,550 pounds was the next highest. Other crops harvested were beets, gobo, china peas, radish, lettuce, nappa, onions, spinach, and potatoes. In August, cabbage and carrots will be added to the list of crops harvested during July.

An all-time high in hog slaughtering was established last month by the Livestock Unit when 322 head of hogs were slaughtered. During the month of July, 31,144 pounds of pork, 4672 pounds of sausage, and 10,705 pounds of lard were delivered to Mess Operations.

supply of the serum, and Commander D. Paine, medical officer at the Klamath Falls Naval Air Station, stepped into the picture to order an emergency flight from the air station to the coast and back to deliver the serum quickly. The flight was made late Tuesday by Lt. D. M. Raschio, Navy flier, who piloted his plane through bad weather on the coast in his effort to save Ryoko's life. The serum was delivered to Dr. Sleath, waiting at the airport, who rushed it to the hospital here, where he and Dr. Boardman administered it to the baby at once.

It appeared for a time that the fight would be successful, but Ryoko's case turned out to be one of the 25 per cent in which the serum, although it is the only known remedy, was not effective.

RESETTLERS MAY OBTAIN MATERIALS

The San Francisco WRA office explained today that resettlers wishing to apply for building materials and equipment must file applications with the WPB. These applications are submitted through County War Board or Federal Housing Administration offices, depending on the nature of the proposed construction, for their recommendations regarding issuance of certificates for the desired items.

The applications are then referred to the WPB for final action.

If evacuees residing in centers wish to file applications for controlled building materials, the San Francisco office suggests that there be attached to each application a statement from the Project Director or Relocation Program Officer to the effect that the applicant is returning to his home under provisions of Western Defense Command Proclamation No. 21 and needs the materials requested in the

RETURNEES FAVOR FRESNO DISTRICT

The Fresno district is leading all other sections of Northern California in number of evacuees returned to their homes, figures released by the WRA office in San Francisco, as reported by its nine district offices show.

The tabulation shows 1103 returnees at Fresno, 910 at San Jose, 539 at Sacramento, 457 at Oakland, 428 at Stockton, 336 at San Francisco, 331 at Visalia, 94 at Santa Rosa and 82 at Watsonville.

SHOE STAMP #22 BEING DELIVERED

A shoe stamp is now available for every resident of Tule Lake Center, as validated by the OPA on Aug. 1, and the stamps are now being delivered, John Neal, head counselor of the Social Welfare Section, announced today.

Shoe ration stamp No. 22 is being issued to each resident directly through the Block Managers Organization, and no interview or application is required to obtain it.

Special shoe stamps, however, will be issued only to those demonstrating need of them, and applications for special shoe stamps should be made at the Welfare Discussion Center, 601, through Hanako Iwasaki.

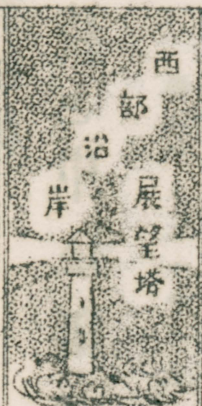
