SHIPMENT OF ASHES TO JAPAN HANDLED BY SWISS LEGATION

John Neal, head of the Welfare Section, said today that arrangements are being made in Tule Lake Center to send to Japan, through the Swiss Legation in Washington, the ashes of persons who died here, and who are known to have relatives in Japan but none in this country. The Welfare Section is undertaking this appropriate disposal of ashes under a recent instruction from National Director Dillon Myer.

Ashes of persons with relatives here will be placed in the custody of those relatives when they leave the center.

MINIDOKA CAMP CLOSES 9 DAYS AHEAD OF SCHEDULE

HUNT, Ida., Oct. 23--Departure today of the last resident from Hunt's evacuee community left the Minidoka Relocation Center a ghost town nine days ahead of the scheduled closing date of Nov. 1. The closing of Minidoka as an evacuee center was announced officially by William Rawlings, project director. All terminal departures were orderly and without incident.

Minidoka had 2258 residents remaining on Sept. 15, when relocation planning was completed and the final scheduling of departures began. About three fourth of the resettlers returned to their former homes in the states of Washington and Oregon.

More than 7000 of 13,048 persons inducted into Minidoka came from the Puyallup Assembly Center in Washington, the first group arriving in Aug., 1942. A smaller number came from

TRANSPORTATION SCHEDULES TO BE BETTERED SHORTLY

Transportation difficulties which have been slowing up departures of Tule Lake residents for relocation are clearing up, W. K. Holland, relocation program officer, said today, and shortly resettlers will be able to leave on more satisfactory schedules.

The strike of Pacific Greyhound Bus Lines drivers ended Tuesday, and it has been possible to make arrangements for departures at present of 75 or more persons a day, he said, thus clearing many people whose plans had been completed but whose leaving had been delayed by the transportation lack.

Adjustments which will be made during the next few days, Holland said, should bring about once more regular and unhampered departures of resettlers as their plans are completed.

the North Portland Assembly Center in Oregon. The only Minidoka residents who originally were from California arrived here by way of transfers from Tule Lake and Jerome.

All but 1200 acres of the land on which the center buildings and facilities are situated have been turned back to the United States Reclamation Service, the agency from which WRA obtained the 33,000-acre tract. The farm land first cultivated by evacuees, consisting of 1116 acres, has been leased to private farm operators.

AUBURN BAPTISTS ACT TO AID NISEI VETERAN

The Auburn Baptist Church has undertaken a drive to supply additional funds for the reconstruction of a dwelling near Loomis, belonging to Cosme Sakamoto, a Nisei soldier, according to the Sacramento Bee. The home was destroyed by fire last month on the eve of the return of Mr. and Mrs. K. Sakamoto, parents of the soldier from a relocation camp.

The fund was started with a \$100 contribution from the late Orrin Lowell, a former Auburn attorney.

Rev. G. E. Harms, pastor of the church, stated a free-will offering will be made at the church during morning services on Nov. 4.

"The offering will be made as a gesture of sympathy and appreciation toward the Japanese American

family," said Rev. Harms. "Four sons of the family served in the armed forces, one losing his life.

"It will also serve as a sign of protest by church people against lawless forces operating in the area."

Cosme Sakamoto, the soldier, was flown to the United States by the army after he had been granted an emergency furlough.

GENERAL STILWELL'S ACTION COMMENDED BY SECY. ICKES

General Joseph Stilwell's recent suggestion, in an interview in New Delhi, that United States soldiers form a "pickax club" to protect Japanese-American veterans from discrimination at home, has been commended by Secretary of the Interior Harold Ickes, as described by the Associated Press in the following story distributed to most of the newspapers of the nation:

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19--(AP)--Secretary of Interior Ickes today commended General Joseph Stilwell for his recent suggestion that American soldiers form a club to protect Japanese American veterans from discrimination at home.

In a letter to the commander of the Tenth Army in the Pacific, Ickes said: "We are troubled with a tireless minority of racists in a few West Coast communities who have sought to keep Nisei veterans and their families from returning peacefully to their farms and homes in the Pacific States."

However, Ickes said, there have been many instances of aid given to the Japanese Americans by their fellow citizens.

"I am confident that our people at home will keep

up the fight against prejudice aimed at Americans of any race, color, or creed," Ickes wrote.

He cited two instances to explain his point.

"Mr. and Mrs. K. Sakamoto had four sons who joined the Army," Ickes letter said. "One was killed in action and two have been decorated for bravery. Recently the Sakamotos returned to their home in Loomis, Calif. They found that two days earlier their home had been deliberately burned to the ground, yet within a few days Californians had started to raise a fund to help rebuild the Sakamoto home.

"In another case Mary Masuda of Santa Ana, Calif., found that her four brothers in service meant nothing to four hoodlums. Not even the fact that one of her brothers lost his life at Cassino impressed these hearty bigots. They warned her to leave town, and she did. Shelter was given to her on her last night by the parents of a Marine flier lost on Guadalcanal. I think that the aid and comfort they offered her, as much as anything else, explained why Mary Masuda later went back to Santa Ana and this time remained there."

NEW HOSTEL IN NEW YORK TO ACCOMMODATE 60 PERSONS

A new hostel to accommodate 60 persons will be opened in New York City next Monday, Oct. 29, under the auspices of the Unitarian Service Committee, the Administration was informed this week, in a five-story building conveniently located at 58 East 102nd Street, just off Fifth Avenue, in a cosmopolitan neighborhood.

The building has 44 sleeping rooms, a dining room seating 60 persons, a fully equipped kitchen, and lounges and recreation space. The hostel is within a 15-minute bus ride of Grand Central Terminal and a five-minute

walk of Central Park.

Mr. and Mrs. Goshichiro Mitani, Issei from Granada, will be the hostel's manager and house mother. Mitani was in the chinaware and art goods business in San Francisco and Los Angeles before evacuation and at Granada he was a block manager and a welfare counselor, and was active in the Co-op. Mrs. Mitani managed a Los Angeles restaurant for 14 years, and also had boarding house and hotel experience in Santa Rosa.

The new hostel will afford additional facilities in the New York area, with the Brooklyn Hostel continuing to operate as usual.

REMOVE OR MODIFY RULES FOR EMPLOYMENT OF NISEI

With the end of the war against Japan, the United States Civil Service Commission, the United States Coast Guard, and the War Department have removed or modified restriction or special regulation applying to employment of American citizens of Japanese ancestry.

Under the Civil Service Commission recision, Japanese American citizens now are certified and may be appointed in the same manner and in accordance with the same procedures as other American citizen eligibles for employment in the federal government.

Coast Guard regulations disapproving employment of American citizens of Japanese descent on vessels and waterfront facilities, and excluding such citizens from vessels and facilities

ties have been cancelled.

The War Department has rescinded restriction on employment of Japanese Americans at Army posts and other facilities, and special requirements for issuance of airman identification cards.

WATER PUMP ENGINE DAMAGED IN FIRE



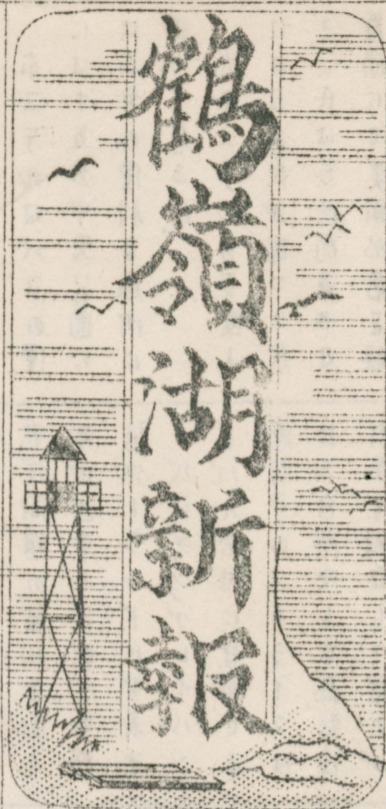

転住局の各転住所肉鎖工作は大車輪を以て進捗、茲に峯土加肉鎖所の肉鎖が報せられた。同所の肉鎖は十一月一日と決定されて居るが、去る亦三日の最終列車を以て何等の遅延を生ぜず秩序正しく予定期日より九日前に肉鎖され主なきセントアイは、突然と日本人立退史の残骸を留めて居る旨ウヰリアム所長は発表した。

峯土加では最後の転住計画を樹立、発表を制作した九月十五日には二二五八名の日本人が居住して居るが、ウヰリアム氏の三は華州及オシゴンの旧居に帰還したと、峯土加の人口は一時一三、〇四八名を数へたが、約七千名以上は

パイアラップ集合所より移動されたもので、最初の入所隊は一九四二年八月同所に到着した旨報じて居る。其他北ポトランド集合所より入所して居るが加州人はジエロム及び鶴嶺湖より移動された人達だけであると。

制限令撤回

シビルサービス及軍部の

日米戦争の終焉に伴ひ聯邦シビルサービスカミッショントが軍防備隊及び軍部が現在迄日本人に適用して居る制限令又は特別規則を撤回又は修正する事となったと、シビルサービスカミッションでは日本人に認めるとし、且つ聯邦政府に準備する資格のある米人に施行する同様の態度、又は手続を以て準備する事になった。

フリストガードでは船舶又は沿岸防備施設勤務の機会を日本人に与へてなかつたが今回撤回したと発表した。

陸軍省では哨地及び他の特別施設への勤務又は飛行士としての身分証明書の発行を禁止して居るが斯も制限令を解除したと。

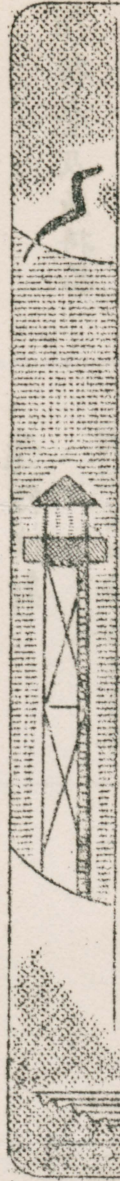

司法省は司法省管掌下の抑留所内の自発的帰国申請者、WRA管理下に在る鶴嶺湖センターの居住者で、司法省の管掌下に在る、自発的帰国者並びに鶴嶺湖居住者で、帰国の申請に依り司法省に移管された自発的帰国希望者、日本に送り還す為、約二千八百名の收容能力を有する船舶が十二月七日又は七日頃沙港より出帆する旨、当所長ベスト氏

司法省より当所民の爲め発布されし指令の説明として次の如き諸事、が擧げられてゐる。

司法省発表事項

約二千八百名の收容能力ある日本行船舶は、十二月七日頃出帆する豫定なる故、本船に乗船帰国を希望する人々は、十一月廿六日(月曜日)正后より、プロセシング建物内の移民帰化局出張

部に出頭、帰国手續を行はねばならぬ、但し、十一月廿八日(水曜日)正后を、受付の切日とする。

認可される人は

帰国を許可される人々の條件は次の如くである。

一、自発的帰国を希望する外人、或は市民権離脱者の内、獨身男子及び單獨帰国申請者(男性)

二、自発的單獨帰国を希望する外人、又は市民権

を抛棄せる獨身婦人、三、男女小供を包む家族組、右の場合家長は自発的帰国を要請する外國臣民、或は市民権離脱者たるべし、然し、見童は米國市民とも包含する。

四、外人又は市民権離脱者の妻子、或は他のセントラに居住せる者の内、自発的帰国を希望する場合、其の兵船、今回の船で帰国し得る許可を取得するを條件とする。

之等帰国を認可される人々は健康体であり、ねばならぬ事、の條件が附されてゐるが、但し、病人と雖も歩行出来得る人、或は小数の糖尿、病者、は例外として、認容されるが、歩行不能の病人及び妊娠七ヶ月の妊婦及び三ヶ月以下の乳兒は、帰国出来ぬ事となつてゐる。

特別注意

今回の船で帰国を希望せざる者は、本船に乗船されず、例へば、前帰国を請願せる人と雖も、本船にて帰国を要請せぬ時は、帰国する必要を希望せぬ者は、プロセシング建物に出頭する必要を要し、帰国を欲せざる者と雖も、如何なる場合にも、處罰される事なく、生活状態、又は様式は現在の儘で、何等の变化はない。

荷物

日本帰国者の許容された持参荷物は、全重量を百七十五斤とし、船室持込荷物は、又、手荷物は、六十斤を限度としてゐる。船室は、白七十五斤より、手荷物の重量を差し引いた、残餘の重量に限られてゐる。

委託權契約書、財産所有證書、取引書類、移民事項書類、現金、トラベル小切手等は、審査される為、各自の身に付け、船室に入らざる事。

十四才以下の子供は、船室は、持つて行けざるも、六十斤の船室持込荷物は、許可されて居る。
