## ICE SHORTAGE DUE TO ARMY DEMAND AFFECTS CO-OP

The main reason why ice is not being sold by the Co-op is that the Army took over the supply of ice in Salt Lake City and Provo, the Management announced today.

The announcement said, "Before the construction of the ice box at the General Store, the Co-op made arrangements with the WRA to have ice shipped in from Provo. To be doubly sure, negotiations were also made with the Quality Market of Delta to effect delivery on a satisfactory basis.

"However, because of the shortage due to unexpected Army demand, the WRA is unable to obtain its contracted quantity, and there is not enough ice to meet the needs of individual dining halls.

"Therefore, the Co-op decided against buying ice for re-sale until the supply is more than sufficient to meet all WRA requirements. The Co-op will then handle ice for the convenience of individuals.

"The Co-op also wishes to make it clear that the present shortage of ice is not due to the fact that the ice box was built."

# BLOCK MANAGERS AID IN DISTRIBUTION

The Salt Lake Tribune was made available to the residents of every block through the cooperation of the Block Managers, it was announced by Jiro Nakaso, Supervisor of the Service Division.

"In order to assure equitable distribution of the copies available," Nakaso stated, "the Circulation Department, under its new policy, is issuing to all block managers cards (at \$1.05 per month per copy) authorizing a block representative to receive the Tribune at the Canteen.

"These copies will then be left at the office of the Block Manager for reading by the residents of that block. A copy will also be available at each of the Topaz Libraries."

(Recently the supply of papers for the Co-op was cut to only 75 daily and 100 Sunday papers. Deliveries to regular subscribers were discontinued and the copies available were sold, temporarily, at the Canteen.)

Sunday papers of the S.F. Examiner and Chronicle, N.Y. News and Mirror, Chicago Tribune and Denver Post are still available at the Canteen.

### WITHDRAWALS FROM BANK CAN BE MADE AT ANY TIME

In a reaffirmation of the previously announced policy on safe deposits, N. Takakuwa, Manager of the Banking Dept. stated that all depositors are free to withdraw money from their safekeeping accounts at any time.

Takakuwa said, "Depositors may draw out any amount they wish either before or after leaving the center."

Currency in 100, 50, 20 etc. dollar denominations is available; however, Takakuwa urges those who feel that it is unsafe to carry currency to purchase Bank Money Orders which can be cashed anywhere.

Help us keep our record correct and up to date. Please be sure to inform us of changes in your address and also the addresses of your friends and relatives. -- R. M.

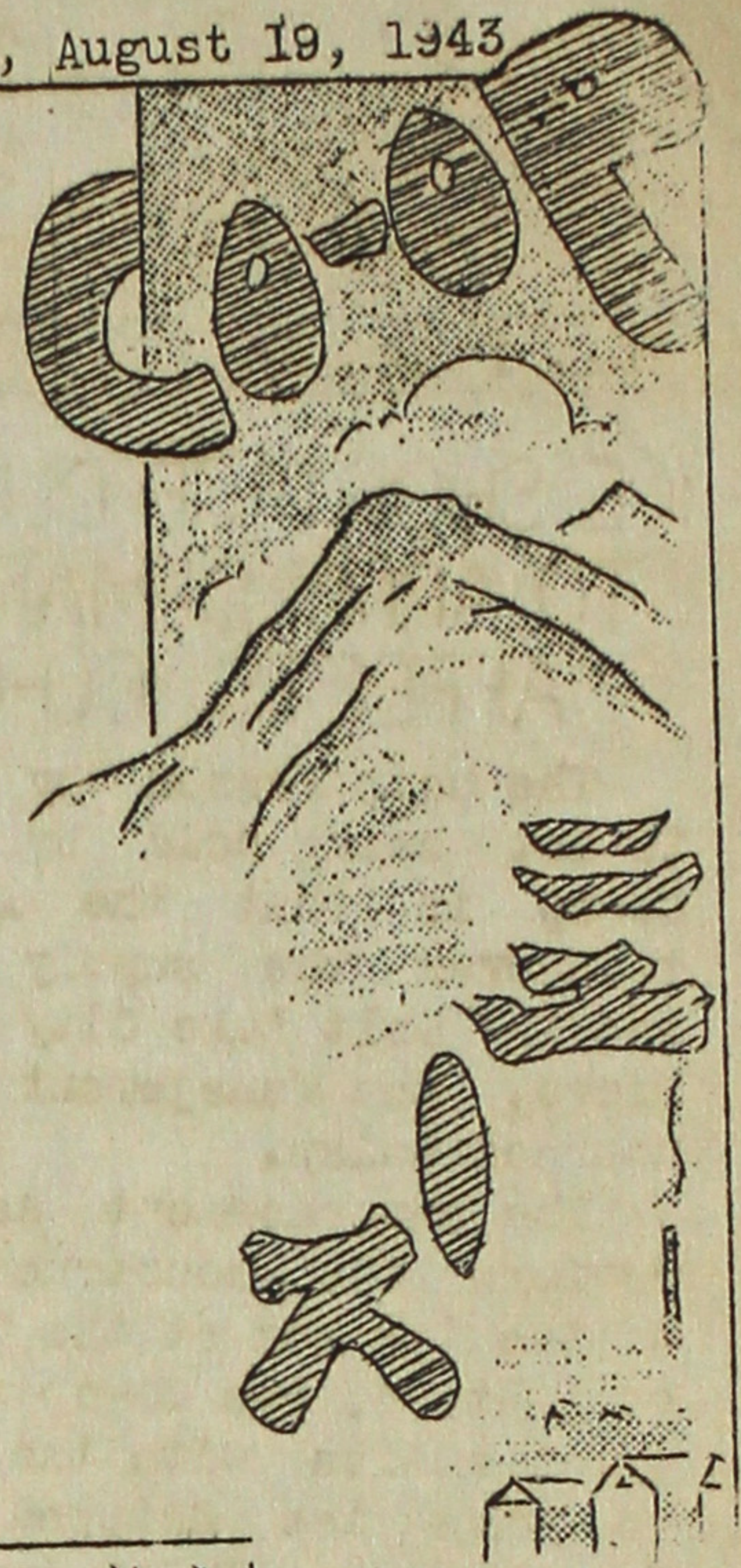
### MURONAKA NAMED EDUCATIONAL MANAGER
