TO THE MEMBERS

This column is our regular weekly feature article under a new title. It will contain messages from the officers, editorials, items on personnel and features to acquaint you with the principles of consumer cooperatives.

As the midyear election for board members was held this week, we are presenting the following outline stating briefly the duties of the board.

The Board of Directors should:

(a) Meet regularly and often enough to keep close track of the business, and get well acquainted with all of the major problems.

(b) Develop unity and harmony by giving careful consideration to each point of view, but always abiding by the wishes of the majority.

(c) Require of the manager regular and sufficiently comprehensive reports of the standing of the business, so as to keep well informed.

(d) Guide and help the manager in his work as the business executive of the organization.

(e) Present the facts so clearly at Congress meetings that the members can vote intelligently on the problems presented.

(f) Faithfully carry out the decisions of the Congress meetings.

(g) Maintain continuous and effective educational work among the members of the cooperative for the purpose of deepening their understanding of the principles, methods and aims of the cooperative, and of enhancing their democratic control.

(h) Require all committee chairmen to submit quarterly report of the work accomplished and recommendations for future committees.

SANITATION PREVENTS SALE OF FRESH FISH — MANAGEMENT

In answer to numerous inquiries, the management stated that the Co-op does not handle fresh fish because it is difficult to maintain satisfactory sanitary conditions, especially during hot weather, as there are no facilities for cleaning fish.

(Other centers are selling fish in the laundry, however, reports indicate this is not satisfactory.)

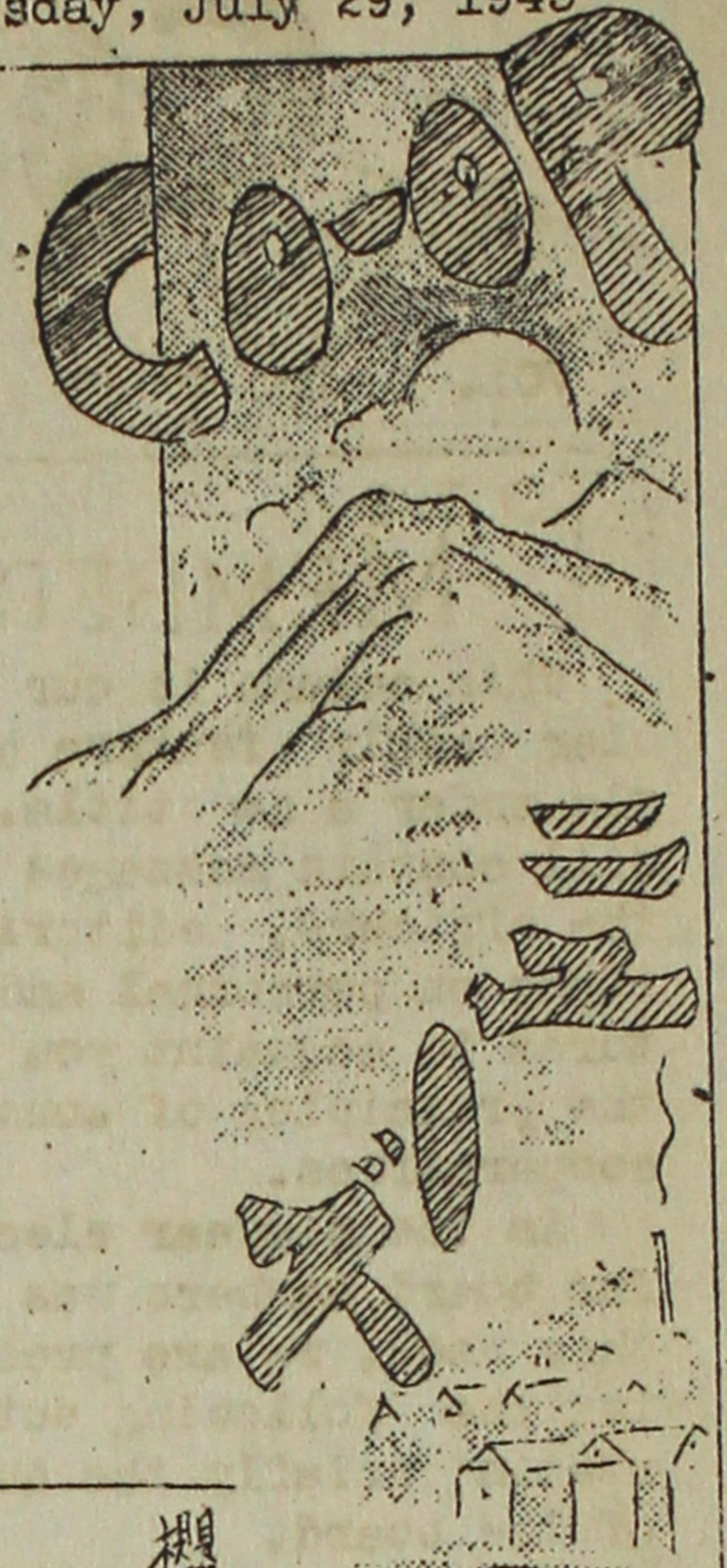
EYE GLASS CASES

Eye glass cases are now available to those who wish them at the Eye Clinic for a nominal charge.

In order to give adequate service to the residents, the Co-op must make additional investments in fixtures. Also, space is not available.

To render maximum service, the supply should be obtained at the source. The Pacific Coast, principle source of supply, cannot assure any steady delivery and this may also mean that fish may not be received in good condition.

The management also stated that the Co-op has absolutely no connection, directly or indirectly, with the Delta fish market.
