6. Kazuichi Takanishi, alias Ichilchi Takahashi, ISN-HJ1757-CI - Age 54; transferred to the Mainland 21 March 1942;
two sons in the Army; arrived in the Territory 1906; three return
trips to Japan in 1931, 1934 and 1935; married to a dual citizen
and has seven children; registered the births of five children;
one son is an alien; one son was attending a university in Japan
at the outbreak of the war; was appointed a consular agent but
resigned his commission in October 1941; claims that his appointment as a consular agent was honorary and he never performed the
duties; president of the Kehaha Japanese Association in 1941;
committee member of the West Kauai Educational Association which
controlled Japanese language schools; assisted in the 1935 and
1940 census; entertained visiting Japanese naval officials;
reported to be active in the collection of Japanese war funds;
at the time of his hearing had \$500 in American bonds; none of
his children have been expatriated; was not questioned by any of
the agencies concerning his loyalty; excerpts of letters and
telegrams in the MID file indicate that his request for repatriation was granted but apparently his request was later withdrawn;
subject's case was reviewed by The Commanding General's Review
Board on 20 January 1944 without a written review. The foregoing
facts indicate that subject would be entitled to a total of seven
points, from which is deducted one point because of the fact
that his son is residing in Japan and possibly is in the Japanese
Army. Accordingly, it is recommended that subject be placed in
Group II.
