our voices. Mrs. Abbe
gave up & changed the
subject so we ended up,
by giving her macaroni &
jello & were the best of pals
now.

I hope you are not
working too hard & I
hate to see you get all
tired out. I don't see
how you can work
more than ~~to~~ eight hours
a day as I am all tired

out at the end of that
 time. Don't forget to
 be a good boy on Wed.
 nites even tho I'm not
 around. I'm only getting
 kidding as I know my
 "Jug-Head" is behaving all
 the time. Anyway, I miss
 you terribly tonight & am
 looking forward to Sat.
 nite. I hope you're
 missing me tonight too.
 I know you're terribly
 lonesome now - least
 don't mind it too
 much because we'll have
~~a~~ a happy future together,
 won't we?

Went to bed early last
 nite & caught up on my
 sleep. Tonight, I gotta
 iron my clothes or else.
 I won't have anything

to wear tomorrow. Today
was pay-day but I
haven't cashed it yet.
Wonder how I should
spend my money this
week? Should I buy
shoes, or a purse, or
a new suit?

Got a postcard from
Jean + she told me to say
"hello" to you. She's work-
ing on a farm earning \$16 a
week.

I hope your letter will
come tomorrow. Goodbye
until Sat. Bonnie, + take
care of yourself.
