Dear Ronnie:-

Just a line to say "hello." Why didn't you drop in to see me yesterday. I got a ride into camp & arrived there about 8:30 a.m. & left 8:30 p.m. & I'm sorry I didn't get to see you.

Well, today is blue Monday & I sure feel tired. It's hard work making your own living as compared to the easy life in camp. I go to work about 8:45, lunch hour from 11:30 - 12:30 & quit at 6 p.m. Time goes pretty fast when I'm busy so it's not so bad. My boss & the girls that work there are very nice to me.

Mr. Berman was saying he would like to find some specialized work for you. He's been transferred to the territory around Jacalillo but Mrs. Berman thinks she will be staying on. Mrs. Berman is really nice - she's looks like part Hawaiian & she's very friendly & motherly looking. They have two little boys, Gerald

3 yrs + baby Ronnie, 10 months. You should come out & see them sometimes.

How are your classes coming along? Did you get the silk cords yet? Out here, I'm so busy, I don't have time to knit or any thing like that. I've seen one show since coming here + have gone bowling once. Last Thurs. we were all invited

to a party at a Caucasian lady's home. You see, she invited all the girls doing housework here in town + there were 24 of us gal. However, your friend, Mae Tomita was not there so I haven't met her yet. There are lot of girls here in Twin but very few boys.

There are five boys working in a garage but only one in Dry Cleaning plant.

Did you get any results from the letters you sent to Salt Lake & Chicago? This town really isn't so bad if you're working - you don't have the time to get bored, but I'm still planning to go to Salt Lake City in the near future. I'm sure you would like living

on this side of the fence, Ronnie.
I don't want to encourage you to
get out of camp too much knowing
how your folks feel, but I'm sure
you'd be much happier on the
outside. At least you'll be getting
away from the nosy Japs in
camp.

Well, I'm still waiting to take
you out to lunch so why don't
you come up & see me sometimes.
I sure miss the kids in camp but
I see so many Japs out here,
I don't get too lonesome.

Let me know if you want any
shopping done - I'll be glad to
do anything I can for you out
here.

Well, be good, Ronnie, & be home your
self. I'll be in for sure Sunday so
drop around best try & come out
before then.
