Please do not worry about us as everything is going to be all right. I think we are going to Puyallup Reception Center. We are not too unhappy about it though we will hate to leave Cleveland and our friends.

We are very busy with the farm these days. About an average of 150 boxes of spinach a day are cut. Radishes and onions are getting along very well.

We are now having our spring vacation, and doing a lot of sewing. Did you have a nice Easter? Did you have a nice dinner? We had eggs but did not color them. This Easter wasn't as nice as years before, but it was all right.

How is the weather over there? It really feels like Spring over here now. Today, it was very warm, and the sun shone all day.
Many flowers are in bloom. Our cherry tree is just starting to blossom.

I baked some peanut butter cookies today, and am sending them to you. Hiro is also sending some Girl Scout cookies. We hope you like them.

Please try to write to us more often.
