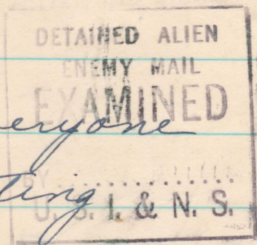


January 25, 1942

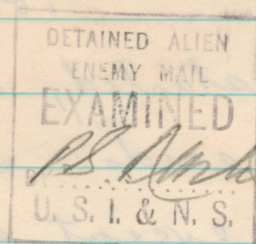
Tell Mr. Hoayasu that his family is all right.

write to us as soon as you can.

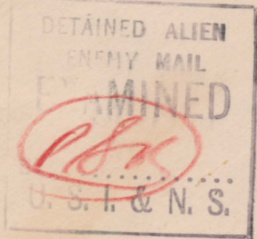
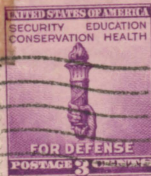
