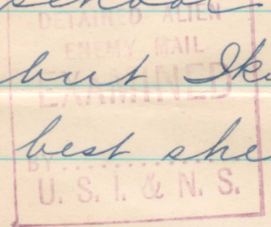


February 6, 1942

We got affidavits from three of your friends, and we are sending them to the District Attorney. They are from Carl, Marie Buhl, and Zenner.

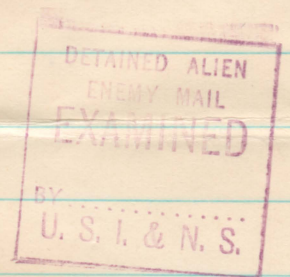
Mama says she wants you to write a letter yourself sometimes. It's okay, even if you do make mistakes. Please try to write it yourself next time.

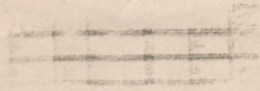
