The following are provisions passed by the Legislature for the relief of delinquent taxpayers:

1st. Interest is remitted on the payment of delinquent taxes of 1931 and prior years, if paid prior to March 1, 1934. 2nd. As a further inducement, if such delinquent taxes are paid prior to December 1, 1933, a rebate of five per cent of the original tax will be allowed. Payment may be made of any one or more years.

This is an exceptional offer to persons whose taxes are delinquent and particular attention is called to the fact that if advantage of this opportunity is not taken before March 1, 1934, the interest will revert back to the regular rate of ten per cent per annum from the original date of delinquency. The great saving that can be made under this plan is probably better shown by the following illustration:

King County tax rolls at the present time show between ten and twelve thousand pieces of property on which taxes are unpaid for the year 1927. Suppose you are the owner of one of these delinquent properties and the tax was, say \$50.00. The interest at the regular rate on this tax would be \$26.31, figured to Nov. 30, 1933, or a total of \$76.31 to clear the 1927 tax on that date. On the other hand, if you take advantage of this relief measure and pay the tax on or before that date you will receive a rebate of \$2.50 in addition to the cancellation of interest, paying but \$47.50 to clear the tax, thus making a saving of \$28.81 to you.

Another avenue of relief is also offered to the taxpayer who is unable to make full payment of all delinquent taxes under the foregoing provisions, and this too, is offered only for a limited time, and must be taken advantage of prior to December 1, 1933. Under this provision the current 1932 taxes must be paid in full, and an installment of one-twentieth of the total amount of the delinquent taxes of 1931 and prior years, with a like installment being due every six months thereafter until all of the delinquent taxes are paid, interest being added to the unpaid balance at the rate of six per cent per annum from June 1, 1933; the taxpayer thus saving the interest that would have accrued under the regular rates on account of the delinquency. Anyone interested in this particular mode of payment should call at the office of the County Treasurer where full details and any further information desired will gladly be given.
