Your experience with the local constabulary in North Carolina was interesting to Mr. Lindley and Mr. Harbison.

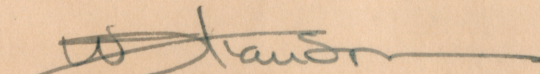
Regarding provost marshal clearance for work in defense industry, it is necessary that you make application to the Internal Security Officer serving the district where you are to be employed. The War Relocation Authority does not present cases for defense clearance to the Join Board. A copy of the Internal Security form on which you make the application is enclosed.

Your application for the relocation assistance grant should be made to Mr. Coronin. He will help you fill out the application form WRA 300 and will send it here for processing.

Your trip is beginning to pay dividends--three indefinite leaves were granted last week for employment with Mr. Fullford.

In that you have not been employed in private industry, it will be necessary that you have a release or statement of availability. A letter which might be of some assistance in this connection is enclosed.

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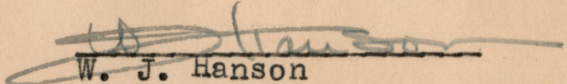
