Dear Ken:

This letter is about the unfinished business regarding the property registration in Japan. It's been a long and drawn out process with a number of setbacks. The most significant set-back occurred when the original attorneys gave up on the case.

We have reorganized under the guidance of attorney, Takio Fujii, of Tokyo. The letters of March 21, 1984 and August 9, 1984 are enclosed to refresh your memory; explain his game plan; and indicate where we stand today. (The yellow lines represent areas that remain unfinished.)

Once again, we need your signature and notarization on the enclosed two documents:

1. Agreement of Division of inherited property.
2. The Affidavit.

When all twelve of the heirs return the above documents the intended registration can be completed.

The enclosed check of \$50.00 is to cover notary fees and whatever other expenses and inconveniences you may incur.

I really appreciate your cooperation in this matter. None of it has been easy.
