Sally dear - your book of travelers cheques
I arrived Thursday and if we are
not banded before morning I'll put
them in my safety deposit box at
the First Berkeley Branch of the American
Trust marked with your name and
Hans's and if anything should
happen to me they would
eventually be returned to you.

I don't expect to go away anywhere
this summer and so you need
only write a line and I'll send them
to you when you want them.

I said they came Thursday but I believe they
were at the P.O. waiting for me when
I came back from Boulder Creek
Wed. P.M. Commencement was Wed. and
I didn't go to it. Instead I went to
the Allens cottage in Boulder Creek
in Santa Cruz mts. for three days.
It rained most of the time but was very
beautiful. The ceanothus is at its

height. We went the too late way because
the roads are better and use less rubber.
I've missed seeing the spring, not that I am
complaining of so slight a sacrifice
but I'm glad I've seen it other years.

I was determined to sleep out
directly under the stars so I put my
bed out on the open porch Sunday
when we got down there. At bed time
there was a mist but I thought
that didn't matter, presently
there were large drops and then a
deluge. I spent the next two days
getting the blankets dry and my
nights within four walls. Not my
idea of a vacation. I did see
birds, though, and had lovely walks in
the wet woods between showers.

Our exhibition was quite good this
year Mrs. Miller spent a long time
arranging the weaving part of it and it
looked lovely. She is a pleasant
addition to the dept.

Both today and yesterday I spent
at the Dept. Working on the new
course now that it is over!!

I'm still trying to get Miss White
to do the slides for me without
having to wait for each lot.

She is slow and inefficient but
there seems no help for it.

Genev Stajich has been marking
slides for me. We have refiled a
large pile of antiques and returned
some books to the library but it will
take afternoons all next week to
get the place in decent condition.
I really would like to get down
to the surface of my new desk.
I have needed you to straighten me
out.

This is Sunday eve. This should have
been mailed long ago. I hope by now
that some arrangements have been
made so that you can go to Mr.
Wrights. If there is anything that I
can write or say to anybody

please tell me. Of course you
may use my name as a
reference. Also if you would
like anything for yourself or
the baby that I can buy here
please tell me. How about Mike's
Vitamin B and Cod liver oil?
Shall I send you some? I'm
sorry that carrots are off her list.
This allergy business is horrid.

The ~~brush~~ drawing did not
get wrapped up to send. I now
have the proper wrappings and I'll
send it to you when ever it is
convenient for you to have it.

The week of finals and exhibition was
a very full one. Mary Lou Hardy
helped me read the exam papers.

I'll write a better letter soon.
In the mean time, dear, you have
even more of my affection and respect
than before if that could be possible.

U. C. Scholastic Laurels Go to Japan Evacuee

Somewhere at a Japanese evacuation center, Harvey Ako Itano, 21, will be notified that he was awarded the University Gold Medal, highest scholastic honor to go to a member of the graduating class, at ceremonies this afternoon in the Greek Theater. Itano was evacuated on April 22 and was therefore unable to receive the honor in person. He was also awarded the degree of bachelor of science in chemistry, which with the medal, will be forwarded to him as soon as university authorities learn his exact location.

Itano, who was a pre-medical student during the past semester, had a straight "A" average during his four-year college course, topping all other members of his class in scholastic excellence.

He was a member of Sigma Xi, national scientific honor society; Phi Beta Kappa, national scholastic honor society, the Honor Students Club, the student health committee and the Y.M.C.A. cabinet.

He registered from Sacramento where he was born. His parents were born in Japan.
