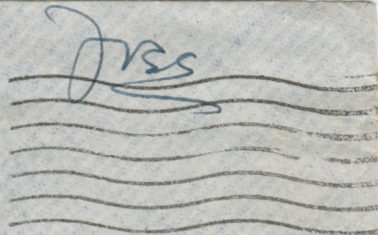
P.S. Hi Kan !!
