Just to let you know that I went on a wild goose chase tonight. It took me 1 hr + 45 minutes to get out there then I waited for an hour but the man didn't see the owner. He wouldn't give me the owners name either. Gosh! I told him how important it was to me. I left my name + address + Phone. If he doesn't let me know by the middle of this week, I'm going to contact the owner by some means or other. It took 35 min. on the N.Y. Central + New Haven line.

I also asked the boy from Staten Island to look around again for me. The ferry only takes 30 minutes. The hills might really interest you. This Island used to be a very good residential district so the atmosphere is still there. Picturesque too. Well, something will come up real soon I know. Don't fret about the \$100⁰⁰ I paid. It was not a down payment but just to show an honesty of intention to buy.

I saw Euki + Johnny on the street on my way home from New Rochelle.

I was coming out of the subway. I shall see her tomorrow night. It sure was good to see her.

Gosh! I couldn't work much today. My mind wouldn't function.

Thanks for your letter, it came this morning. The first chance I get, I will send you another box of candies and also toys for the kids. Well anyhow, I shall write soon again.

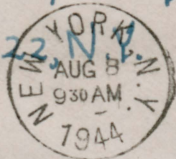
