

Aug. 13, 1944

Dear Sally:

I had your letter yesterday and it makes me feel bad that I can't help you with the kids when they cough so much. Is it asthma or some other thing? I will send KIII's coupons to you - the whole book.

Yesterday I went to New Rochelle again and found things pretty much at a standstill. I found the properties that I was interested in belong to an Estate and that it hasn't been settled so I looked around some more elsewhere. I hope this one comes out. This house is \$3,250 and fairly out in the open, altho there are neighboring houses. Grocery store near by. Town of Yonkers about 12 minutes on a trolley which runs right by the house. A New York Central line station about 4 blocks away. I'm going up there Tues. again. Going to close the deal this time because I think I will have the enough cash down payment. We will have to wait awhile because there are tenants in the house. I don't know how soon they will be moved but probably within a month, which makes it just right.

This house is down in the vale. The other was up on the hill. It may be still possible to get the one on the hills. Will find out Tuesday.

Yuki is here now. I have met her several times. Same old Yuki. They are looking for an apartment now. They will find it with Yuki there. Gosh! both of them are up this morning - going to look for an apartment. Good for them. Yuki sure puts things going. It sure is swell to see them snap into it.

I will buy some films pretty soon. I had supper with Julie and Anna Andow at their apartment last night and enjoyed the rice and eating with chop stick. Wait until we get our place, Sally. It sure is going to be made a home.

Well, I will write very soon the other half of this letter,

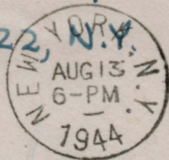
