I know for one thing, the flower prices are high now but will probable come down later on but bedding plants will sell very well. Altho the first 3 or 4 months may be hard, we may be able really to stake a good beginning.

I'm going down town today to see several other architects who asked me to see them at the end of this week. Maybe phone a few and see a few.

Dont have to forward any Arch. Mag. here to Baltimore, I see them at the library. This library is certainly swell. It has a music library. You can borrow records and they even have a music room where you can sit and listen to music. Swell! Ch!

I sent Tak a telegram telling him to come here as soon as possible and then we will make plans. I want to show him some of these Markets here.

Snowed under now. They gave me a
small catalog. They also have a
well landscaped garden that covers
quite an area - Sales garden
combination. Office is a beautiful

money there.

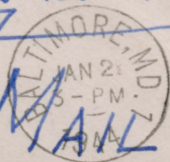
I've been buying Norfolk paper
