The boy pictures tell no lie - I know I have been gaining but the boy those pictures show it very plainly double chin - the space around the waist (although it creases by it seems to me just roving in the picture. Very Beware - Beware Son - the mark of 40 is on you - look out beware - I'll have to reduce before I have any more pictures taken. It is good for us to have pictures taken to see ourselves actually. If you are printing by any chance you can print me 2-4-7 - they will not have to be enlarged. There is no hurry for them - I guess you will be packing by the time this letter reaches you. I hope it will get there in time.
