Dear Kan.

We received your letter the other day and thank you very much.

Things don't look so hot for any of us now. Most of the single boys that we knew & others has been getting their IA cards and a few ready for the physical exams before long. As I look at things now I don't think I should be roaming around for the time being until such time that I may know how I stand. I had in mind about farming some where near a large city in the eastern part of the country. Or on the other hand a job in the radio line, or a radio operators or listening or monitor station man if such a possible position is open to us.

Since the last time I wrote I have gotten another job here. Fixing jute boxes & pin ball machines and some time one arm bandits. hi! Same place as Tak Nishiyma. Pay shall be good from the second month but starting not so good. Hideo is in Salt Lake now, yes selling West Coast Life Ins. again. He seems to be doing pretty good so far.
