example the fellow playing some sort of instrument, though small and seemingly delicate is our village blacksmith. He



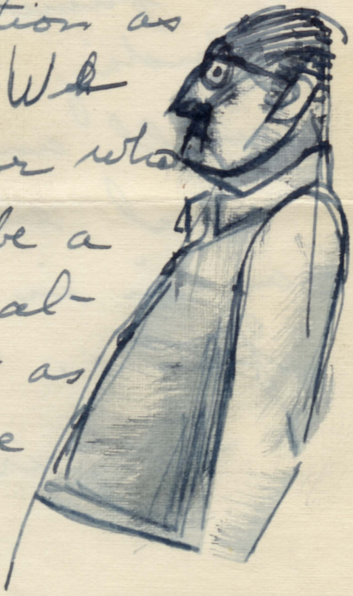
used to teach metal work
