The camp was monopolized by Savage boys on furlough. It somewhat helped take away the feeling of apprehension about the coming draft.

The fellows are taking the news rather calmly.

For myself, it is a matter of wait. Just how I would be affected is

the matter to be determined by the present physical requirements. Was classified as 1B before war listed out. (1) Bad eyes (2) Osteomyelitis of leg.

Received rather unexpected news from A.P. that Mr. Nammi will come here in the near future. It may be a matter of days - not more than 2 weeks that he will be here. In any case I will be able to come out East and meet you sooner than expected.

Rumor was heard that it will be after February that a true drafting of us will take place. In all cases it would be ~~in~~ some time to view our position under this drastic change of future actions.

Have more or less - unofficiously - quieted
farm work and am leading to take
it easy. Might start making contact
back East as feelers. Have no particular
plans as yet.
