new with a defense plant doing  
ordnance work. In the meantime  
I'm going to the library to brush up



on Technical knowledge.

I cannot say much more about  
about the place as the Company  
request for values just came in  
by phone through local U. S. E. S.  
The U. R. G. is investigating now  
the terms and conditions.

Will keep you in close touch  
with my luck.

The town is jam tight cluster  
of big massive buildings with small  
streets running in all direction.  
Am going downtown to the shopping  
district - if I can find it - and  
try to find something to send to  
the Simons in appreciation  
for all they have done.
