Dear Kan,

Thanks a million for the house plans which you sent me several days ago.

The more I study the plans--more I like it. General plans of the Scheme #1 and scheme # 2 are ggod, but as you stated in your letter I am inclined to agree with you on Scheme # 2.

As to your question on the width: I think that 14 feet is perhaps wide enough, but if another 2 or more feet can be added without too much additional cost and at the same time by adding few extra feet will not interfere with the architecyual ideas, I just as soon have it little wider. As to the trees in front, there are plenty of room there. For your information, I am enclosing couple of rough sketches and measurements. Hope they will be of some value to you.

You will note in the measurements which I am enclosing, that the inside width of the present porch is only 7 ft.-3in. What is your idea or rather what do you think of the present width of the porch for the dining room? As to the kitchen it does not have to be too wide for efficiency and also the balance to be added can be increased to take care of the needed space. Is it practical or advisable to add about 2 ft. to the present porch width? That too I am not insisting, because I have seen lots of small dining room, and really I would rather have much larger living room than dining room.

Although I am not too familiar with indirect lighting and ventilations. I think that I am going to like it. Ventilation from under the porch to get the clean air, especially in the dust times, I think it will be a big help. In your final plans, please give me more detail plans on exhaust ### fans, light trough, ventilation system, & etc.

What are your plans on the existing fireplace, leave it as it is and built another at the new spot which will be about 12 ft away? If it does not seem too crowded on the north side, I just as soon have a fireplace left as it is in our new bed room.

Recently I have been looking around for new ideas on remodeling & etc. and have hit on the idea of combination home-office and library idea. Am tearing out the pages and enclosing for your consideration. What do you think? Do you think such plans can be incorporated into states scheme # 2? Perhaps on the west side without interfering with the west wall of the living room. In such case it will give us another room for guest if needed. How about another closet (water) and lavatory on that end? All this is not an absolute necessity, so omit it if you think it will spoil the present plan, because I like it just as good as it is.

It seem that the lumber yards are beginning to get more lumber now. But do not know how good the material. or the prices. Regardless, there are several of our Japanese people are making plans to build soon.

It looks like I have to move the Cedar Deodora ?? anyway, because it is getting to be big tree and perhaps too close to the new addition. That's the only tree that I feel will be a shame to remove if I cannot transplant it. The garage and the adjoining buildings, I had plans to remove it regardless. So do hestitate on account of such obstructions.
