to do some shopping in the way of material for a coat
etc. I'm not sure when Wahis birthday is but it
must be soon so I think I'll get her a pair of
pigskin gloves.

How are things coming? I hope my last letter didn't
annoy you too much - but the more I think of it
I feel we shouldn't try to do very much over even

you have to think in terms of avoiding the draft if possible - if you can get into defense work in your line that would be really fine but then again even if it isn't your line we're going to have to live somehow - so one ~~is~~ can't be too picky - I don't mean to take just anything but not to be too too particular.

Roy, Mary & Sheldon left this morning - she & the kid are going to the Cincinnati hotel & Roy will go on to Dayton & try to find a house to buy. He still has his job there. They sent regards & were sorry not to have seen you.

The number of guys relocating now is quite amazing - the list in the paper is about twice as long as before. Oh - the Ford plantation business - you know the one somewhere in the south has been decided against - not enough people interested.

Zorba sent some more copies of your father's picture & these are really swell - nothing as burned out as the other & not quite as blown up.

Wash got a letter from Mr. Shibusawa today but
she hasn't said anything. Oh - she's decided that
what's left of the funeral money (some \$50) is to
go toward paying for the workers.

Mrs. Nakanishi talked to me for sometime today
& she pretty unhappy - something is happening
to Dick & apparently he's making her life
miserable by criticizing her for every little thing -
she feels he's no longer the swell guy of last
year & the year before. She overheard something
you & he were talking about one night when
they thought she was asleep - & really feel
your sister is a bad influence there & so does
Mrs. Nakanishi. I think as soon as Mrs. Nakanishi
transfers to this camp things will be different as
apparently his grub were & will try to straighten
Dick out on several issues.

I got a letter from Chico & she says she'd like to leave
camp with us ^{or join us later} - she feels dissatisfied with their
high school & wants something better - which is

a good thing, I think.

You has talked to me several times about plans etc -
& man, oh man! I realize the type of person she
is now so will have to go from now on
~~with~~ expecting anything cold & cutting to happen -
God, honey - she thinks she has a
very good psychiatric background - Can
you bear it? Its people like her who
know just a little bit about something who
make the grade by blapping along & talking
fancy. She knows she can sell herself to
any job - ~~as~~ that's what she told me.
