
Thank you for your letter of July 20 in reference to your clearance for work in war plant.

Dear Mr. Thomas:

Mr. McCloy has asked me to reply to your letter and inclosure with reference to the employment of Kaneji Domoto.

The records of the Office of The Provost Marshal General indicate that two applications for employment were received on behalf of Mr. Domoto; one, dated February 14, 1944 for employment as mechanical draftsman at the Chemical Warfare Center, Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland, and one dated February 22, 1944, for employment as a mechanical draftsman at the Maryland Engineering Company, Pikesville, Maryland. Subsequent to the receipt of these applications, The Provost Marshal General's Office was informed by the War Relocation Authority that Mr. Domoto, who had been living in Baltimore, Maryland, had secured employment in New York City and is presently residing at 330 E. 57th Street, New York City. In view of this information, no action was taken on Mr. Domoto's applications for employment in Maryland.

If, at the present time, Mr. Domoto is desirous of obtaining employment in any specific plant or facility important to the war effort, a new Personnel Security Questionnaire should be executed by him, indicating his proposed employment. Information as to the correct procedure to be followed in forwarding this Questionnaire can be obtained by Mr. Domoto from the office of Headquarters, District No. 1, Second Service Command, Army Service Forces, 39 Whitehall Street, New York City, N. Y.

Upon receipt of a new application from Mr. Domoto, it will be given immediate action by the Office of The Provost Marshal General.

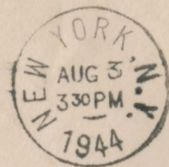
