hangout, and saw her home. I spent a good hour at her cottage talking to the gold there before coming home. I killed the whole night but it was worth it.

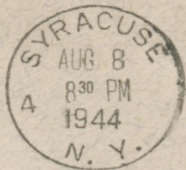
