I know how you feel, with the heat in New York. as it is getting a lot warmer over here now. But sure am glad that mine's only some weather now as so of this weather. as I don't really go for this hot weather.

Have met a few of the Hawaiian boys over here. at the usual meeting place, over a glass of vino. And you don't kidding when you say there a tough bunch. But there O.K. with me. the way I met these boys, I was lining along side of them for a while. and we used to go to the same vino joint, which was right behind the joint I lived in.

over in Africa. However much to my

sent one.

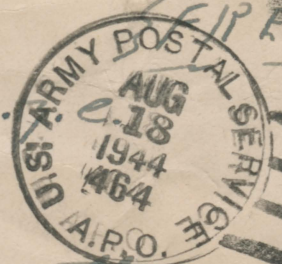
Am sending you a snap shot, we

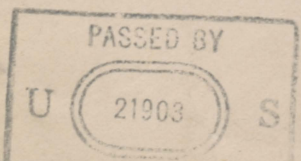
