Dear Choko: Sorry I'm so bad about writing but things keep piling up & I haven't had very much free time — we've been having so many "stay awhile" visitors that I'm a bit weary & worn from taking care of 'em — cooking for three or four men with big appetites — & the usual washing & ironing — I guess it's pretty bad to become just a housewife but I guess I might as well try to do a decent job of it as long as I can't do much else with the kids as young as they are.

I was awfully happy to get mama's letter — today I got one from Kain — and it seems he isn't going to sell the nursery for various reasons ^{about} which he's probably written to you. He says he wants you all to come out for a couple of months & then go back to Calif. If you do my suggestion (which is really Kain's idea) is to have you relocate out here (New Rochelle, N.Y.) — you can stop in Chicago & then go up to Michigan & stay awhile & then come here — you might as well have the gov. pay the trip out as far as we are since it's what we'll ~~obligement~~ to most — & then pay the side trips yourself. If mama is worried about the possibilities of Kain being drafted if he goes back to Calif. (that's very likely because a few kids we know had that happen to them) why not decide

to stay out here for 6 months or a year. Kan suggests you could go to some N.Y. college or university - commute - it takes only 35 min. by train — our second floor will be vacated either late this fall or early next spring & you could have it - (2 bedrooms - kitchen - bath - living room) — until its empty you'd have to crowd yourselves into our front room but that can't be helped. Since Mr. Knott is at the nursery & would like the lease to be renewed after it expires in March I don't see much reason for hurrying back - esp. with the draft possibilities for Kain.

Mama said in her letter that she wasn't particularly anxious to return to Hayward.

Oh - tell papa & mama that Mr. & Mrs. Ishamaw came to see us about a month ago - they came in a beautiful Cadillac - working in New Jersey at the home of some very wealthy people (president of the Argo Linite Starch Co) - they looked awfully well but said they wanted to go back to Calif. & be with their old friends - had dinner with us & I fed them "udon" which they liked & ate a lot of.

The brown material for Kain's suit came sometime ago - thanks a lot & sometime soon I'll be making it up for him — also your photograph came the

other day & I must say its not a very good one - the light is very bad but I guess its the best you can expect in camp. Thanks a lot anyway.

Its been so rainy & humid that I'm not j worn out just from this weather - the kids are growing fast and are full of energy — they're really very cute & attend so much attention that sometimes I feel its very bad for them.

The other day I bought a pair of shoes for Nida & had to pay \$6.95 for them! — Isn't that awful! Kangu's shoes cost \$5.00. but that's how much Dalway's pay for them — so it wasn't bad but 6.95 seemed quite a bit to me though Kau didn't care.

Kau is working at a better office now — for a very well known architect — he likes the job — the people — & is going to get a raise next month.

Tohoku Kishi (Kau's sister) has gone back to Livingston & seems to be getting along alright.

The hills are waking up from their nap now so I'd better close — please have ma-cha (you) decide soon to come out — you might as well see the last of fall (its really beautiful) — the business of deciding

when to go back to City. can be planned after
you come east.
