twice — that child drives me frantic — even Ken gets worried
when he's around — If Lorrie ever asks me to keep an eye on him
I will simply have to refuse. He's worse than any child I know —
it's all her fault because she's so damned tame but just the same
the less I see of him the happier I am. They've brought some
property about 60 miles from here & will probably put up a
Dorothy house.

We have seen the Nip architect again - he stayed over the week-end & tried very hard to convince us that we should apply for a Ford fundel in grant ask of Japan for a year.
