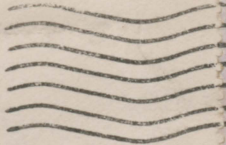
Is this too little and too late again? I am so sorry. I am sure that if this clearance had come through sooner you would be nicely "roosting" in Baltimore.
