Dear Dad:

I received your letter to-day and am glad to hear that you are well. Things must be much the same around camp. We are working on a labor gang. The work is pleasant and does us good after being in the Cheyenne jail. The feeling is good in here. The guards and the inmates are very courteous. In fact they treat us better than the people outside.

Tell Miyaka and Kimiya not to come to see me. According to the officials we might possibly be moved so if we should be, it would be a waste of time and money. Even if I should be here I could only see them for one hour in one month so it would not be worth it. Tell them to save the money. I appreciate it just the same. I put Miyaka on my Relative and Correspondence list but she does not have to write me because she can hear from you. There is a lot of red tape to write to George so tell his wife I will not write to her or him. I cannot write to a married woman.

It was nice of Mr. Burnett to
remember me. Anyway tell Miyaka
not to come see me as I am getting
on very well, in fact better than at
camp. I will get to see them in a
year or two at the longest anyway.
It is best they do not write me either.
Its that is up to Miyaka. They cannot
send me anything either. We receive
everything necessary anyway.
Tell all my friends Hello.
