My dear Agnes:—

This is of all business letters. I will give George \$100- in June, \$150- in November, and I wish you to help him \$250- Of course this is fixed, but if any more expenses has risen, we have to help him because we do not want him to be discouraged with his hand life.

About taking ^m money to Syracuse, \$300- check in Sept. and \$200- on Feb. 1st Both we will send to Prof. Revels. (Payable to George T. Rockrose)

This fund will be deposit to Treasure kept but must have approval by Mrs. Allis or Prof. Revels, when George wish to draw money.

As soon as George settled

there

he must take Life Insurance Policy - 35-yrd - Endowment \$1000- to protect himself. And Mother you take care of that premium. It will be about \$6⁰⁰ 1/4 yearly payment. (\$24-)

Mr. Yeagan lost his interest on George now, he hasn't see George for seven or eight weeks. That is too we have to arrange with a doctor in Syracuse. Perhaps cost \$2- each treatment.

You better make a loan \$200- on my policy in Sept. first week. So we can have that for our emergency fund in Corn Exchange. George in S. U. is well taken care of. There is university; Hospital ~~and~~ nursing care and board etc is included

in

tuition \$335 - per year. Only we have to pay operation fee.

Any time, sweetheart, if you needed money draw this fund - this ours not mine!

About my staying here is depends on whether I can make any improvement and I can accomplish any of my desire. If not I will out go. But board & room is much ^{higher} ~~more~~ now. \$50 - per month be the minimum.

This is all our business part.
