I am ^{now} inviting Miss Crowther to take Mrs Parlett's place

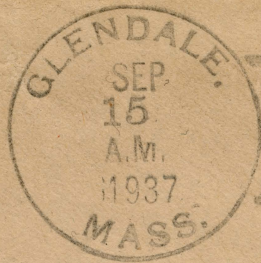
during the latter's vacation.
