I was born in the year of 1876, June 7th. in the city if Yamagata, province of Unen. My father was a contractor of buildings, and kept stores for supply for No.32 Regiment, and the hard were store at \$110 Eajimachi, Yamagata.

In the year of 1863, I was graduated from the district school, called Note-Sho-Sakko. Then, I entered to the English school at Yanagata while Mr. Henry Noore was the principal, and I studied English for two years.

At the age of eighteen I was obliged to discontinue my studies in order to assist my father in business. For four years I, they, was in contractor's business and made little money, but at the end of the fourth year I lost large sum of money by miscalculating cost of ithem at the contract of the part of barrack at Alita, Ugonokumi. At the same town I built the Girls Newal School, while I was completing the barrack there. The lost was too heavy for us. Finally father made me to step my business until I know semething more about architecture.

so, I came to Tokio, in 1800 to hunt fortune in order to make up my lost at the Akrita job. I was, then, possessed of nothing save my own body. My reputation down went. Confidence flow far way from me as if no one even trust me for a dime. Friends were turned into strangers. Relatives became my enemy. The hard time of seven long months most alowly passed away.

In March, the year of 1900, all was thirty yeas in my pocket went to Canton, China, with restless ambition and hope to accomplish something but all was in wain on account of the Bener War.

Four years from thomes I wandered around the different countries namely: Naley, Sumatra, India, Africa, and Europe. And at last I was drifted to United State America on the 23rd. Sept. 1904.

By means of self-supporting I entered to the Buchtel Academy at Alren, Chio, in 1905 and graduated from this school in 1907. In the following year I entered to Buchtel College which now called Alren University. I there remained only year in stucking mechanical engineering.

I passed the examination and I was admitted to enter for the Architecture Department at Syracuse University in 1998, and entered on the 20th. Sept. 1998.

In the second year I was elected for the business manager of the Cosmopolitan club at S. U. In my third year I won \$30.09 prize by the competition of decigning the gate way to the Burtley Park, Syracuse, N. I.

In my fourth year I was elected for the Vicepresident of the Architecture Socity, at S. U.
