RULES

1. No alcoholic beverages of any kind at LSR. If you are found in possession of, or if you have consumed alcohol or drugs of any kind or any amount, not limited to:
 - 1) any form-beer, wine, grass, etc. and
 - 2) any amount-one hit, drag, swallow, etcyou will be brought before the cabinet for discussion of probable and immediate expulsion from camp. There will be NO refund of fees, and you cannot attend Camp Redwood, Lake Sequoia Retreat the following year. (You may attend in 2 years.) LSR will supply transportation to Fresno should you require it. LSR is not responsible for your activities once you leave YMCA property. Letters will be sent to your parents and minister, informing them of the situation.
2. Campers will make full settlements before leaving YMCA property.
3. Campers will see that camp is left as clean as it was upon arrival.
4. Campers will keep cabins clean at all times.
5. Campers will not deface camp property.
6. CAMPERS WILL NOT LEAVE CAMP REDWOOD BOUNDARIES WITHOUT CLEARANCE FROM AN ADVISOR.
7. No boating or swimming at unscheduled times.
8. Watersports allowed only with lifeguard.
9. Standing or tipping boats prohibited.
10. No fireworks/firecrackers.
11. Smoking only in designated areas.
12. NO CABIN SWITCHING W/OUT CABINET CONSENT.
13. DECISIONS CONCERNING CAMPERS UNABLE TO ABIDE BY CAMP RULES WILL BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE CABINET FOR POSSIBLE DISMISSAL FROM CAMP.

14. Camp Redwood boats will not be landed at other docks.
15. Lifejackets will be worn while boating.
16. Campers will cooperate with the cabinet in all activities that must be carried through to operate camp.
17. Parking only in designated areas.
