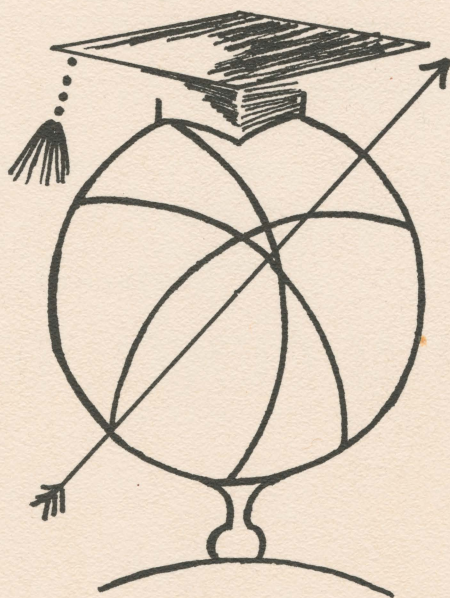

JACL-TAJIRI AWARD

In memory of Larry S. Tajiri, whose contributions in the fields of drama and entertainment, and in journalism, had national impact and importance, for the benefit and betterment of all of us.

Larry S. Tajiri passed away in Denver, Colorado on Feb. 12, 1965, after having served for nine years as the drama news editor of the Denver Post. Prior to that time, he served for ten years as editor of The Pacific Citizen, the official organ of the National Japanese American Citizens League, in Salt Lake City, Utah.

In both endeavors, the work of Larry S. Tajiri achieved national significance. In the field of drama and entertainment, he worked unremittingly to provide for all of us, locally and nationally, a constructive and meaningful development of the arts; as the hard-hitting, forward-looking editor of The Pacific Citizen during war-time years, he contributed enormously to the acceptance of Americans of Japanese ancestry as equal citizens in this great nation of ours.

Because of these personal efforts of Larry S. Tajiri, and because we believe that they should be forever continued, we do hereby establish this LARRY S. TAJIRI MEMORIAL AWARD to keep his memory and work alive and to encourage the perpetuation of his efforts to help make a better world for all of us.

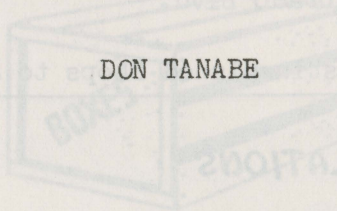

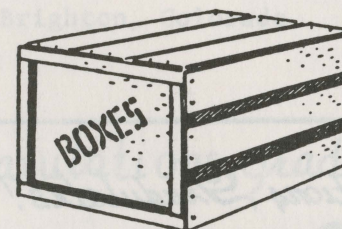

PAST AJA SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

With some wonderful cooperation from these previous winners, the booklet this year includes, on the following pages, a very brief resumé of the activities of each since they graduated from high school. The scholarships awarded these individuals were: the Mile-Hi JACL - Harry H. Sakata Award - one each year since 1956; the Mile-Hi JACL Scholarship - two awarded each year in 1961 and 1962 and three each year in 1963 and 1964; the Cathay Post #185, American Legion Scholarship - one each year since 1963; and the Nisei War Memorial Award - a new scholarship first awarded in 1964.

The University of Colorado is where JANET IDA is conducting her studies with a major in French and a minor in Japanese and psychology. After graduation Janet plans to enter the teaching field on the secondary level. For the summer of 1965 she has received a fellowship to study Japanese at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri.

PREVIOUS SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Pre-Med with a distributive degree in chemistry, biology, math and Spanish is the pursuit of RAY IMATANI at the University of Colorado. Ray's plans are to complete four years at CU where he is active in several organizations, and then attend a medical school which he has not decided upon yet.

Princeton University in Princeton, New Jersey is where sophomore, DARRYL KANEKO, is majoring in economics. We understand that he has a B plus average and is enjoying college very much. His future plans are to do post-graduate work in economics, accounting, and, possibly, law. Darryl would also like to teach.

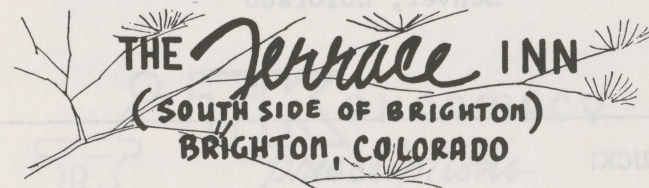

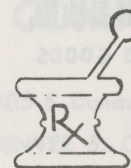

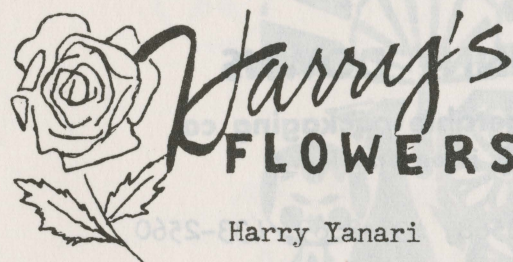
