Dear Mrs. Okagaki:


Guyo and I are leaving tonight for Mexico for a short vacation. According to our present plans we should be in San Jose the second week of November.

## Host of Women Dedicated to Service

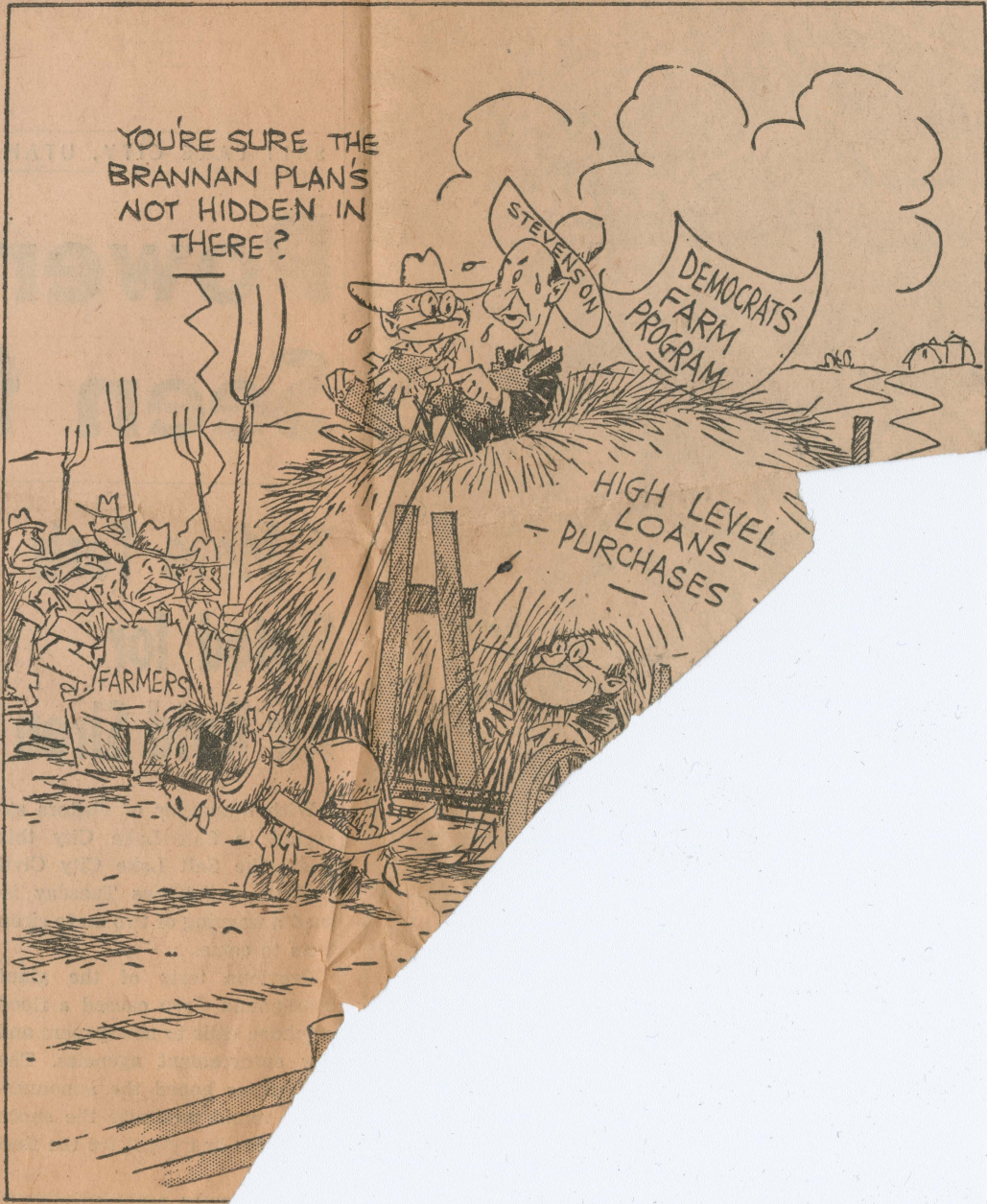

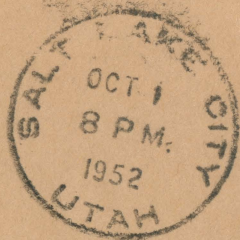
