The WEIGHTED COMMON EXAMINATIONS TOTAL SCORE is the sum of the two Weighted Subtotal Scores.

The COMPOSITE NTE SCORE is the sum of the Weighted Common Examinations Total Score and the Teaching Area Examination Score.

The ADVISORY PART SCORES provide a means of estimating relative strengths or weaknesses in different fields of knowledge for those tests which sample several subject fields. See interpretive leaflet for full titles.

Score Interpretation Leaflet for Candidates

(School and college officials should refer to the *Special Notice* on the next page.)

Enclosed is a report of your scores on the National Teacher Examinations that you took on the date printed on the report. Copies are also being sent to the school systems and colleges that you named to receive your scores. Educational Testing Service cannot furnish information about the regulations of individual school systems or colleges with respect to the NTE. Questions regarding qualifying or passing scores, or eligibility rules, can be answered only by the proper school and college authorities.

Scores on each of the tests in the Common Examinations range approximately from 30 to 90; on each of the Teaching Area Examinations from 300 to 900. Advisory Part Scores can range from 3 to 9. Practically all combined scores fall in the following ranges: Professional Education Subtotal, 117-351; General Education Subtotal, 183-549; Weighted Common Examinations Total 300-900; and Composite NTE, 600-1800. Scores outside these ranges occur very rarely.

An example of the method used to compute various combined scores (Subtotal, Total, and Composite Score) is given in the box (below).

Tables 1-4 in this leaflet permit you to determine in several ways how your scores rank you among groups of college seniors that have taken the NTE for the first time. If your exact score does not appear in a table, you can estimate your rank by finding the percentile rank for the listed score closest to yours. (You can make a more precise estimate if you are familiar with the process of interpolation, but such precision is rarely meaningful.)

Table 1 will tell you how your scores on the Common Examinations rank you in relation to a sample of 10,870 college seniors. If, for example, your Professional Education Test Score is 63, the corresponding percentile rank is 60. This means that you scored higher than approximately 60 percent of the norms group, and that about 40 percent of the group achieved scores equal to or higher than yours. (Similar interpretations can be made for other scores and their corresponding percentile ranks.)

As a further example, assume that you obtained a Weighted Common Examinations Total Score of 661. Table 1 shows that your score corresponds to

a percentile rank of 75 in the sample of 10,870 college seniors. Assume, too, that you took the Teaching Area Examination in Art Education, the field in which you are best prepared to teach. By referring to Table 2, you can estimate your rank on the Weighted Common Examinations Total Score in relation to a sample of similarly prepared college seniors. You will find in the Art Education column that a Weighted Common Examinations Total Score of 661 corresponds to a percentile rank of 85 in the small group of 288 Art Education seniors.

Moreover, if you obtained a Teaching Area Examination Score of 629 in Art Education, you will find in Table 3 that this score, located in the Art Education column, has a corresponding percentile rank of 60 among the 288 Art Education seniors. Finally, by referring to Table 4, you will see that your Composite Score of 1290 (661 + 629), which is slightly higher than the score of 1286 found in the Art Education column, has a corresponding percentile rank slightly greater than 75 among the 288 Art Education seniors.

You can determine whether your scores are above or below the average for the given samples of college

seniors by comparing your scores with the corresponding 50th percentile scores in each of the tables. Here, "average" refers to the median rather than the arithmetic mean of the seniors' scores for each group. If your scores are compared with the scores of a different group of candidates (for example, all candidates applying for a specific teaching position

in one school system), your relative standing in that group may be quite different from your rank in the groups of seniors on which the four tables are based.

An Advisory Part Score may indicate particular strength or weakness in a specific field. Three part scores are reported for the Professional Education Test: Psychological Foundations of Education,

Societal Foundations of Education, and Teaching Principles and Practices. Two of the General Education Tests yield four part scores: Social Studies, Literature and Fine Arts; Science and Mathematics. Comparative strength or weakness can usually be inferred when your part scores differ by 3 or more points. Differences of only 1 or 2 points may not be meaningful.

Score boxes containing "x's" indicate that part of a test or an entire test was not taken. Thus, if you attempted one of the tests in the Common Examinations but did not answer any of the questions that contribute to a part score, the box for that Advisory Part Score will have an "x". Further, if you omitted all questions in one of the tests in the Common Examinations, "xx" is reported for that test, "x" is reported for each Advisory Part Score derived from it, if any, "xxx" is reported for both the Weighted Subtotal involving that test and the Weighted Common Examinations Total, and "xxxx" is reported for the Composite NTE Score. A Composite NTE Score is reported only if you took all four of the Common Examinations and a Teaching Area Examination on the same day.

"Absent or Scores Delayed" printed on a score report may mean that the candidate took the examinations but some difficulty has delayed processing his answer sheet(s). When the difficulty is resolved, a revised report will be issued. Failure to receive a revised report within four weeks indicates that the candidate was absent.

If a candidate's scores on the tests deviate inexplicably from scores achieved at an earlier administration, or from the level anticipated by his college record, school and college officials receiving his scores may request rescoring service or further identification of the candidate.

TABLE 1: Percentile Ranks on the Common Examinations

Based on a stratified sample of 10,870 college seniors tested for the first time in December 1965, March 1966, January 1967, and March 1967. The sample consists of seniors who took the Common Examinations and a Teaching Area Examination in the field they designated as that for which they were best prepared to teach.
