

FAMILY ALBUMS

The family in Japan has much greater significance than in American society, and the loose immigrants brought this attitude with them. Parents, especially the mothers, monopolized the children's activities closely, and the children in turn learned of their obligations to the family. Individualism seemed to be stifled, but a closeness of family ties was promoted. These pictures fail to reveal the cultural conflicts which inevitably occurred between the Japanese parents and American-trained offspring, especially about such questions as dating. They also fail to make it clear how much the parents were Americanized by their children's influences, and the subtle ways in which the children's attitudes were influenced by the parents.
