Dear Senator Vandenberg

I am very grateful to you for ~~introduction~~ <sup>re-introduction</sup> of a private bill to correct my immigration status. With six children ranging in ages from nineteen ~~to~~ to four years old, all U.S. born, my deportation will be very unfortunate to these children.

Now, I understand the House passed a public bill H.R. 3566 to stay deportation of more than 2000 <sup>persons of ancestry</sup> Japanese in this country, and this bill goes to the Senate for their approval.

~~In view of~~ In view of the numerous difficulties involved in passing of private bill, I sincerely ~~hope~~ <sup>hope</sup> that you ~~will~~ <sup>will</sup> facilitate the passage of this ~~House passed~~ bill before this Congress adjourns.

I came to this country in 1907 at the age of nineteen, <sup>and</sup> have continuously lived ~~to~~ <sup>for a</sup> 40 years in the United States, except six months trip to Japan in 1927 upon death of my father.

I am hoping and praying that I can spend rest of my remaining years in the Great Country with my children.

Again thanking you for the private bill,  
and hoping <sup>that</sup> this public bill, <sup>which</sup> concerns many  
of us, will be ~~soon~~ approved by U.S.  
Senate.
